

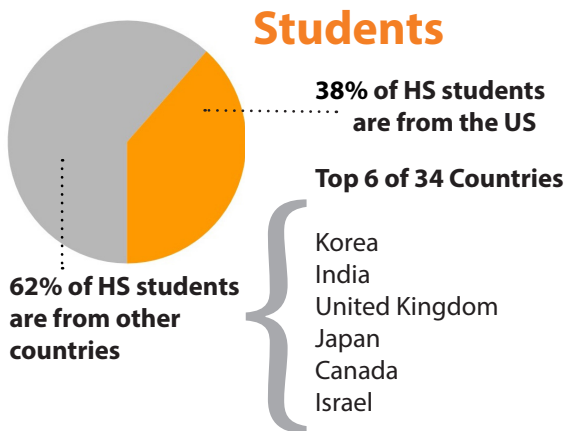

School & Community

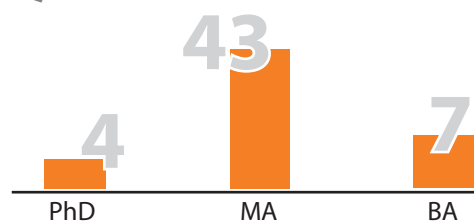
Founded in 1952, the American Embassy School is a non-profit tuition-based day school, located on a 12-acre campus. Enrollment from Pre-K - Grade 12 is approximately 1120. The high school currently serves 340 students with 73 students in Grade 12. AES is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. AES serves students whose parents are employed by foreign service agencies, embassies, USAID, United Nations organizations, and multinational corporations.

Curriculum & Calendar

AES offers a rigorous college preparatory program which includes the International Baccalaureate Diploma and Advanced Placement options. Enrollment in the IB program and AP classes is open to all students. Students may not exceed three HL or AP courses (or combinations thereof) in a school year. The academic year is divided into two semesters beginning mid-August and mid-January respectively. Maximum class size is 21. First semester grades are available after January 22.

Graduation Requirements

Students must complete a minimum of 23 credits to graduate. Specific credit requirements are:

- English ●●●● (4 credits)
- Social Studies ●●● (3 credits)
- Mathematics ●●● (3 credits)
- Science ●● (2 credits)
- World Language ●● (2 credits)
- Physical Education ●● (1.5 credits)
- Health ● (0.5 credits)
- Fine Arts ●● (1.5 credits)

An additional graduation requirement is our compulsory five-day Minicourse each year. Courses take place throughout India and include environmental stewardship, community service, cultural immersion, and wilderness adventure.

Application Limit

Grade 12 students are limited to ten university applications. Universities receiving an application from AES can be assured that the student is a serious applicant.

Community Service

AES' motto, "Enter to Learn, Leave to Serve," is actively upheld by the work of the student-led service Council and 12 community service clubs. AES service clubs work with local children, impoverished communities, human and animal rights, and environmental concerns.

AES has adopted a Standards Based Grading and Reporting system since July 2016. Grades are reported on a "A+" to "I" scale.

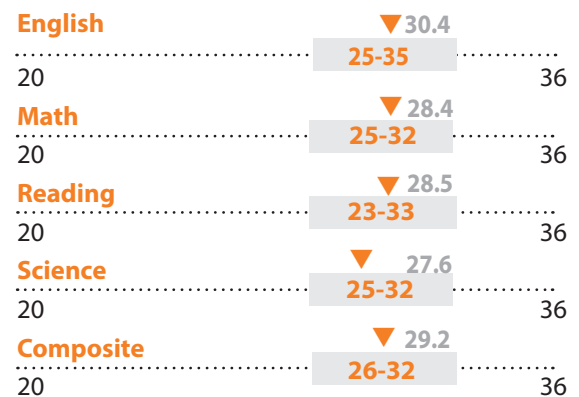

ACT Data for Class 2019

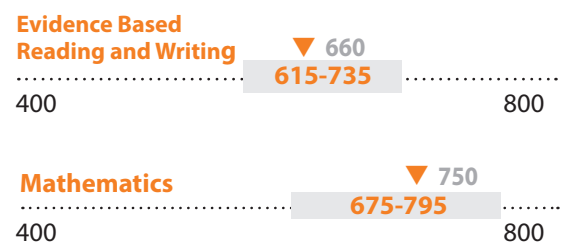
