## **School News**

### **MESSAGE FROM HEAD OF SCHOOL BRENDAN O'SHEA: HEALTH & WELLNESS UPDATE**

"Abundance of caution." Those three words have played a major role in our approach at Saint Mary's to keeping our students and our entire community safe and healthy. We are exercising an abundance of caution by insisting on adherence to protocols, limiting exposure, screening symptoms and temperatures daily, and continually reminding our community members to stay vigilant. We want to keep our community informed regarding our efforts in fighting off COVID-19 on campus. In an abundance of caution, students who present symptoms or who have been exposed to someone who presents symptoms are quarantined until test results are known. When a negative test result is received, the quarantine is lifted. If a positive result is received, the student must be isolated in order to protect others. The adage we've shared is that "by protecting someone else, we are protecting ourselves, as well."

The program we are using daily (to report our temperatures and possible symptoms) processes data over consecutive days, so it has been critically important for each member of our community to complete the information each day, even when off campus. Though we know at some point we may have COVID-19 cases



on campus, having accurate data on hand gives us the best chance to contain its spread and remain in school. We will continue to adhere to a mindset of an "abundance of caution" throughout the remainder of the year to keep Saint Mary's moving forward.




## **SIGMA-MU FIELD DAY CARRIES ON CENTURY- OLD TRADITION**




## **CONGRATULATIONS, NEW CLASS OFFICERS**
