CONTRACT FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION FIRST DIVISION VEHICLE TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

This Contract is made and entered into on the date set forth below, by and between the Board of Education of Norridge School District No. 80 ("the Board") and 303, LLC, an Illinois Limited Liability Company ("Contractor") (collectively referred to as "the Parties").

In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Contractor is the successful bidder for special education first division vehicle transportation services for the 2018-2019 school year. The Board hereby accepts Contractor's bid submittal, upon the terms and conditions set forth herein and excluding any exceptions, differences, conflicts and/or inconsistencies from/with the Board's bid specifications contained in said bid submittal.
- 2. The transportation services to be rendered by Contractor and the additional obligations of the Parties are set forth in the following documents, all of which are incorporated into and made a part of this Contract by reference:
 - a. The Board's bid specifications consisting of 19 pages; and
 - b. Contractor's bid submittal, which consists of 54 pages and which includes a copy of the Board's bid specifications.

To the extent any provision of Contractor's bid submittal conflicts with any provision of the Board's bid specifications, the bid specifications shall control.

3. Any notice required or otherwise given pursuant to this Contract shall be in writing and sent via certified mail with return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or delivered by overnight delivery service, addressed as follows:

Either party may change such addresses from time to time by providing notice as set forth above.

4. MISCELLANEOUS:

- a. This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois; provided, however, that the conflicts of law principles of the State of Illinois shall not apply to the extent they would operate to apply the laws of another state.
- b. This Contract (including the documents incorporated herein by reference) constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes any prior understanding or representation of any kind preceding the date of this Contract. There are no other promises, conditions, understandings or other agreements, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Contract.
- c. The language of all parts of this Contract will in all cases be construed as a whole, according to its fair meaning, and not strictly for or against any Party.
- d. The Contractor may not assign this Contract without prior written consent of the Board.
- e. The covenants and conditions contained in the Contract shall apply to and bind the Parties and the heirs, successors, and permitted assigns of the Parties.
- f. The failure of either Party to enforce any provisions of this Contract shall not be deemed a waiver or limitation of that Party's right to subsequently enforce and compel strict compliance with every provision of this Contract.
- g. No change or modification to this Contract shall be valid unless it is in writing and signed by both Parties.

Proposal and Qualifications

History and Description of Company

303 has been operating an "On Demand" taxi dispatch service on the Chicago North shore since 1946. The name "303" comes from the number on the call box at the Wilmette train station. Customers would dial 303 for service and the available drivers (parked nearby) would answer the Call box and dispatch themselves. We are currently providing services for most of the senior subsidy programs located in Lake, Cook, and DuPage counties. We provide 13,000 to 18,000 rides per month to "Special Needs Students" who attend specialized schools in Lake, Cook, DuPage, McHenry, and Kane counties.

For the past 33 years we have been providing more transportation for "Special Needs Students" than any taxicab dispatch company in the Chicagoland area. 303 currently dispatches to over 113 Illinois School Bus permitted operators providing services that total in excess of 11,000 trips per month. Our key dispatch and central office staff have been together for over 19 years and the average period of time the drivers have been providing services for schools is over 8 years with some over 20 years.

The primary contact person for all day-to-day operations will be Marge Sheikh. Marge is the manager of school transportation. She has been with the company for over 29 years and is highly skilled and has vast knowledge of special needs transportation. Marge is accompanied by a staff of 4 highly qualified representatives that have a combined total of more than 40 years in special needs transportation. 303 utilizes the latest communication technology to ensure that someone is always available to address any questions, comments, or concerns. Marge's office number is 847-368-8919, fax 847-368-8920, cell phone 847-344-0734, and email marge@303taxi.com.

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Discussion of Qualifications and Scope

The school transportation unit of 303, headed by Marge Sheikh, is part of a flat organizational structure. Marge reports directly the owners of 303. Within the school transportation office itself, she has four people working with her every day. One person, Vlad Laba, also does school dispatching. Vlad Laba has been dispatching school orders for the past six years. Prior to this he drove a taxi and was a school certified driver for five years. Three other people provide office support and assist with all of the email and voice communication necessary to successfully handle the school's needs. One additional person prepares the monthly billing detail and invoices to the school district.

Information on past contracts held and districts served in the past five years is attached. The number of drivers and vehicles needed has ranged from 110 to 130. 303 has not defaulted on any contracts.

Equipment

All vehicles used in transporting special needs students must meet the requirements of 625 ILCS 5/13-101 and 625 ILCS 5/13-109. All vehicles must be state inspected and pass safety tests every 6 months. All vehicles are independently owned and operated by independent contractors receiving dispatch from 303 and are housed and maintained by the owner of the vehicle. 303 dispatches orders to eligible operators affiliated with 303 Taxicab Association, Flash Cab Co, and Britelift, Inc.

Vehicles to be used will be first division passenger sedans and minivans. They will be from among the 110 plus vehicles owned by members operators described above with capacities ranging from 3 to 5 passengers. There are several vehicles modified for wheelchair access if the need arises.

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All vehicles used for transportation are equipped with computers that are tracked by our GPS system that have emergency buttons installed within the driver's reach. We can track the vehicle's movements, and in the case of an emergency we can direct fire department and police assistance without the driver's help if necessary. Vehicles are equipped with video cameras to record inside and outside the vehicle.

All vehicles pass state safety lane inspections at least every 6 months, with some more frequent depending on village licensing. Driver coordinators also conduct random inspections of vehicles (looking at visual appearance, cleanliness, and licensing).

Since the vehicles are not owned by 303 itself, but by various owners dispatched by 303, if there is a mechanical breakdown necessitating a stand-by vehicle, 303 can dispatch to another school bus permitted driver in another vehicle.

Routes and Scheduling

303 will work with the District to fully communicate route and schedule information as discussed in the proposal specifications. While every effort will be made to accommodate requests from the District, 303 will retain the right to plan the final routes in order to safely and efficiently serve the transportation needs.

Personnel

303 takes the responsibility of transporting your students very seriously and we dispatch only State of Illinois Certified School Bus Permitted Drivers to provide student transportation as required by Illinois law including 625 ILC 5/6-104 and 625 ILC 5/6-106.1.

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A permitted driver is one that:

- 1) Has been fingerprinted with a background check performed by the Illinois State Police looking for any history involving any crimes to children, sex offenders, and convicted felons.
- 2) Has passed drug and alcohol screenings.
- 3) Has passed a physical exam.
- 4) Has taken a State of Illinois training class
- 5) Has passed the State of Illinois exam
- 6) Has attended and met the requirements of an annual State of Illinois refresher course.

Once a driver is permitted and is associated with a transportation dispatch company such as 303:

- 1) The driver's information is added to a Secretary of State list that is updated 3 times annually.
- 2) The State continuously monitors the driver's activity looking for tickets or other information that will cause the suspension of the permit
- 3) The State reflects the permit status on the updated list and sends the transportation provider a letter letting them know that the permit has been suspended so that we can pull them from their route until the problem has been resolved to the satisfaction of the State of Illinois.

Drug and alcohol screenings are done annually to renew the school bus driver permit.

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The background check performed is one that continuously monitors the subject. If any new information surfaces, this is reported to 303 so immediate action can be taken.

Please see attached list of school bus permitted operators. Drivers serving the district would be from the attached list. Drivers would normally be regularly serving the same routes so information on which specific drivers would be serving the District will be established together.

Operations Personnel and Training

Please see above with respect to training. Drivers serving the District are independent contractors receiving dispatch from 303. Therefore, there is not a hiring policy, but rather the verification of the needed background checks, licensing and permits. Many of the drivers have faithfully served schools for many years continuously.

Driver information as outlined can and will be provided in connection with establishing routes with the District.

303 will be conducting its annual safety meeting during the first two weeks of August. The specific date will be established shortly, and can be shared with the District.

Insurance

Insurance coverage is in compliance with 625 ILCS 5/12-707.01. Insurance coverage will meet or exceed the current requirements of the State of Illinois. Insurance limits differ from the proposal specifications. The following describes the insurance coverage included:

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Commercial Auto Liability

\$2 million combined single limit per accident bodily injury and property damage. This is with American Service Insurance Company.

\$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident uninsured/underinsured motorist coverage. This is with American Service Insurance Company.

General Liability

Coverage limit of \$1 million per occurrence, \$2 million aggregate. The coverage is with The Burlington Insurance Company.

Sexual Misconduct Liability

Separate sexual misconduct liability policy with a limit of \$1,000,000. This is with Hiscox Insurance Company.

Workers Compensation

Employer liability limit of \$1,000,000 Applies to office staff, as the drivers are not employees but self-employed independent contractors

This coverage is currently with Wesco Insurance Company.

The above insurance policies provide for 30 day notice of cancellation.

Certificates of insurance are attached.

Should the district elect, a performance bond will be provided. The cost is \$1,000 and will be added to the first billing statement to the district.

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Route Pricing

Pricing is based on:

- a) Curb to curb service where the driver remains with the vehicle at all times, pulls up in the morning and waits usually 3-4 minutes unless otherwise directed by the District before notifying the dispatcher to be released.
- b) We assume there will be a caregiver at both pickup and drop off points to hand off and/or receive the child and that the only assistance the ambulatory child may need from the driver will be assistance with seat belts.
- c) Unless notified by the District to the contrary we assume that we will be able to share the vehicle with other District students and build routes that make the most productive use of the transportation asset.
- d) For ride cancellations, any made an hour or more in advance will result in no charge to the District. Those made with less than 60 minutes' notice will result in the full fare being charged.


Additional Children/Stops:

There is no additional charge for additional students traveling at the same time to/from identical locations based on sedan capacity. For those students with different pickup/destination locations within the same town an "Additional Child Stop" fee is added to pricing stated. For example, 4 children are being picked up at school going to two different destinations within the same town will incur 1 extra Child Stop charge.

Additional extra/special charges are listed on the Pricing Schedules.

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303 has been a responsible provider in dispatching school transportation for numerous districts over many years. 303 is a current provider to Norridge District 80 through LASEC since 2012 and is ready and able to serve the transportation needs of Norridge District 80 without interruption.

If Contractor does not have adequate equipment at the time of award of the contract, Contractor shall provide a certified statement from an authorized dealer, manufacturer, or other reliable source, showing that all necessary equipment will be supplied, and that all such equipment will be available on site for use by Contractor for performance of the contract no later than August 1, 2018. Equipment must be ordered within fourteen (14) calendar days after notification to Contractor of the approval of the Board's award of the contract.

Detailed information including but not limited to the a) vehicle identification number; b) date manufactured; c) name of chassis manufacturer; d) vehicle capacity; e) body manufacturer; f) current mileage; g) location where the vehicle will be maintained and parked when not in use during the term of contract; and h) the date of the last safety inspection for each vehicle proposed for service of this contract must be submitted to support this requirement.

In the event of a breakdown or emergency, standby vehicles in good working condition must be maintained and available in sufficient numbers and used in the event any vehicles regularly transporting students shall be inoperable. Standby vehicles shall meet the same standards as regular route vehicles. Daily use of spare vehicles will not be allowed to exceed 10% of the number of vehicles required to service the contract. A minimum of one standby vehicle for every ten (10) regular vehicles shall be available.

C. Operations and Maintenance

SPECIFICATIONS FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENT FIRST DIVISION VEHICLE (i.e. Taxi cab, Mini-van) TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

All costs of equipment repair, maintenance and operation shall be sole responsibility of the contractor. The contractor shall show evidence at the time of bid of an adequate maintenance facility to provide prompt access to the District, and preventative maintenance and vehicle repairs to all vehicles used in connection with this contact at all times vehicle service is provided.

Indicate the location where the vehicles will be housed and maintained. If facilities are not within the District's boundaries, they must be located such that services can be promptly provided. The facility must house all functions, including storage of vehicles, maintenance and dispatch operations of the contractor.

Bidders are instructed to furnish descriptions, addresses and telephone numbers of maintenance staff for operations and maintenance facilities to be used in the service of contract.

Also include the location of towing and emergency services vehicles to be used in the service of this contract.

The contractor agrees that each morning before any vehicles are used for transportation, the driver shall inspect same carefully for defects, and remedy any defects before using said vehicles.

D. Safety and Cleanliness

Vehicles are equipped for the convenience, safety and comfort of students. Vehicles shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and open to examination by authorized District personnel at all times.

E. Radios & GPS System

All vehicles shall be equipped with two-way radios that will be active at all times. These radios must have a capacity sufficient to maintain contact with the terminal at all route points and a person must be available at the terminal to respond at all times while routes are being run. An adequate number of spare radios must be available so that no vehicle is ever without a working radio while transporting students. The Contractor shall supply necessary requested hand-held radios for each school as requested with the frequency of the vehicles assigned to the District for direct communication between the school and the vehicles. Such radios shall be used in accordance with all existing FCC regulations and/or licensing requirements.

F. Other Safety Features

All vehicles shall be equipped with all safety equipment mandated by the federal government and/or State of Illinois

G. Fuel

SPECIFICATIONS FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENT FIRST DIVISION VEHICLE (i.e. Taxi cab, Mini-van) TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

The successful bidder shall purchase and provide all necessary motor fuels for the performance of the contract. There shall be NO negotiations or changes in the bid language for a Fuel Escalator Clause.

IV. PROGRAM SPECIFIC INFORMATION

See attached **Exhibit 1** for Student Specific Information for the following locations. This Exhibit is subject to change during the term of contract.

See attached **Exhibit 2** for submitting the proposed mileage rate for upon which charges will be determined for the transportation of each student.

V. EMERGENCY CANCELLATION OF TRANSPORTATION

The contractor will follow the District's procedures for emergency cancellation of transportation in those cases where weather conditions may preclude the movement of First Division Vehicles (i.e. taxi cabs, min-vans). There shall not be a charge for services if a regular school day is cancelled.

VI. EMERGENCY DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

When extreme weather conditions or other emergencies require the early dismissal of school during the regular school day, the contractor shall transport students home from school. Specific arrangements for pickups and arrival times shall be coordinated between the District and the contractor.

V11. EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT

The contractor shall either own and maintain sufficient tow vehicles and other emergency equipment or maintain a contract to provide sufficient and immediate emergency service to all vehicles used in performance of this contract.

VIII. PRIORTY USE

The District shall have first priority for the use of the vehicles of the contractor required to perform the service pursuant to the agreement.

IX. SAFETY PROGRAM

SPECIFICATIONS FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENT FIRST DIVISION VEHICLE (i.e. Taxi cab, Mini-van) TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

The contractor shall plan and administer a safety program in conformance with federal and state laws and regulations. The safety program must include, but is not limited to the following:

All Drivers and Attendants

All driver applicants must meet acceptability requirements as indicted 625 ILCS 5/6-106.1. All drivers must participate in both classroom and on -the-road training programs devoted to safety, proper vehicle operation, rules and regulations, and first aid.

All drivers must participate in defensive driving course as certified by the National Safety Council or equivalent training programs approved by the District.

All drivers must be reviewed after thirty (30) days of employment and at least annually and must annually be given a review course on rules, regulations, safety and first aid.

The contractor must insure that there are sufficient substitute drivers to fill in should a regular driver not be able to complete a route.

Drivers' duties and responsibilities will include safely transporting students, assisting students with special needs to board and exit the vehicles, safely seating students, and properly applying safety and/or restraint equipment which is provided for the safety of said students.

Drivers also are responsible for managing student behavior (which could include discipline) to the extent required to operate the vehicle safely, requesting assistance in addressing misconduct beyond that threshold, and reporting significant incidents of misconduct to a school-designated contact person.

X. OPERATIONS PERSONNEL

It should be understood that transportation of school children is a unique and specialized professional service. It is essential that the students be transported to and from school regularly, promptly, safely and without interruption or incident and that the safety of the children in such transportation shall take precedence over the interest of either the contractor and its drivers or the school district. It shall be the primary obligation of the contactor to operate its affairs so the District will be assured of this continuous and reliable service.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENT FIRST DIVISION VEHICLE (i.e. Taxi cab, Mini-van) TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

The contractor shall ensure that no transportation vehicles used under this contract are operated by anyone other than a person holding the required license as issued by the State of Illinois and holding a school bus driver's permit issued by the State of Illinois.

Every driver shall comply at all times with the motor vehicle laws of the State of Illinois and all cities, village or other municipalities in which such vehicles may be operated.

The contractor shall use all due care and caution in selecting its employees and make certain the drivers and all other persons coming in contact with students are of stable personality and of the highest moral character. The responsibility of hiring and discharging personnel under the contract shall rest entirely upon the successful contractor. The District shall have the right to request the removal of any driver from their respective routes.

The contractor shall bear the sole responsibility of all costs incurred in providing qualified drivers or other personnel, such cost including but not limited to training, safety seminars, physical examinations, criminal background checks, drug test license, and permit fees, recruitment expenses, salaries, fringe benefits and other conditions of employment.

All drivers shall maintain a neat and clean appearance at all times. They shall also display identification as employees of contractor. The contactor shall have in its employ during the duration of this contract sufficient drivers to adequately service all of the routes and schedules required by the District.

The contractor shall prohibit its employees from using intoxicants or habit-forming drugs either prior to reporting for work or during the working hours. Such use shall be cause for immediate removal from services to the District.

Prior to commencing services, the contractor shall place on file with the District the following:

- 1. Driver Applications
- 2. Driver Training Records
- 3. Driver Criminal Background Check Information

The Contractor shall perform criminal background checks for all drivers, as well as any other employees having contact with students. The Contractor shall provide copies of all such background checks. The District shall have the right to request that any employee of the Contractor be removed from performing any services for any reason. Following such request, the Contractor shall immediately remove and replace the employee in question.

Each driver shall undergo a drug test as part of his or her physical exam for each initial permit and each permit renewal. A positive test result shall disqualify a driver from providing service

under this contract. Post-accident testing is required. All drug and alcohol testing procedures shall be in strict compliance with State and Federal regulations.

The abstract of the driving record of each driver shall be obtained from the Secretary of State annually, subject to review if requested.

The use of tobacco and alcohol products are prohibited when drivers are performing the terms of this contract.

XI. MANAGEMENT PERSONNEL

The contractor shall have a manager in charge of performance of this contract and furnish the name and address of such manager and the statement that such manager shall have complete authority with respect to all matters relating to the performance of the contract. This shall include matters relating to personnel and the changes and substitutions thereof, adherence to and changes in schedules and responsibility for keeping of records required under the terms of the contract. The manager should have a minimum of five (5) years experience in management for pupil transportation services. The contractor shall make every effort to maintain the same route supervisor for the school year.

XII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The agreement is for furnishing student transportation. In performing this responsibility, the Contractor is an independent contractor and neither Contractor nor any of its drivers or other employees is an officer, member, agent or employee of the District.

XIII. STANDARD OF SERVICE

The sole right to determine whether or not the quality of service during the term of the contract is maintained at the standard previously established is at the discretion of the District.

The parties further agree that any failure to meet this standard of services constitutes default as set forth below.

XIV. CONTRACT TERMINATION

If at any time the contractor fails to comply with any of the conditions contained herein or in the contract to be entered into, the District shall give twenty-four (24) hours notice, in writing, to the contractor of such failure. If the contractor does not remedy the failure within twenty-four (24) hours from receipt of such notice, or if the failure is impossible to remedy within twenty-four (24) hours, the contractor must show satisfactory proof that the failure will be remedied as soon

as practicable; if the failure is not so remedied, or if the contractor shall at any time (except because of weather conditions making roads impassable, or other acts of God or strikes) fail to furnish at least 90% of the vehicles required by this contact for a period of twenty-four (24) hours, then at the option of the District, the contract may be terminated by delivery to the contractor of a written notice of such election to terminate. In this event the contractor shall remain liable for any cost for transportation to the end of the current school year in excess of the cost that would have been payable to the contractor. Failure to exercise rights within twenty-four (24) hours does not preclude any subsequent right to exercise at a later date. If the contract is terminated in accordance with any foregoing provision, all contractor rights shall cease.

In addition, the District shall have the right to terminate its respective contract at any time for any reason or no reason by providing the contractor thirty (30) days written notice of their intent to terminate.

Nothing herein shall be construed to limit the right of the District to provide transportation of children or students required to be transported hereunder during such notice period in the event the contractor fails to provide transportation as required in the contract.

In the event of termination for any reason set forth above, the District at all times reserves the right, without waiver of other rights against the contractor and its surety, to arrange for transportation of students itself or to enter into a contract with another person, firm or corporation, or to do any other act or thing necessary to assure continuity in the transportation of students. In the event of any such termination, the District shall retain any other rights or remedies it may have against the contractor and its surety, including but not limited to, recovering damages for breach of contract and recovery under the surety bond required under this contract.

XV. INSURANCE AND BONDS

- A. The contractor shall carry, pay for and keep in force during the entire period of this agreement on all vehicles insurance to meet or exceed the requirements of the State of Illinois. The insurance must be written for not less than the following limits and coverages, or greater if required by law.
 - 1. Commercial General Liability Coverage
 - a. \$1,000,000 Per Occurrence
 - b. \$1,000,000 Personal & Advertising Injury
 - c. \$2,000,000 General Aggregate
 - d. \$2,000,000 Products/Completed Operations Aggregate
 - e. Coverage must be included for Sexual Abuse & Molestation with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence/\$2,000,000 Aggregate

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- 2. Commercial Automobile Liability Coverage
 - a. \$2,000,000 Combined Single Limit (\$1,000,000 is acceptable, if the Umbrella limit is at least \$5M)
- 3. Umbrella or Excess Liability
 - a. \$10,000,000 Per Occurrence
 - b. \$10,000,000 General Aggregate
- 4. Workers Compensation Coverage
 - a. Statutory limits
 - b. Employers Liability Limits of \$1,000,000/\$1,000,000/\$1,000,000
- B. Any policy under this paragraph shall cover the transportation of pupils, their parents and guardians, authorized chaperones, school district officers, faculty, and employees and school doctors, dentists, and nurses to and from any school or school district on regular routes and in connection with any extracurricular activity authorized by and made in compliance with school policy and Illinois State School Code.
- C. The District also reserves the right to require a performance bond covering each year of this Agreement in the amount of 100% of yearly cost
- D. The State of Illinois must license the insurance companies used. Said companies must have an "A VII" rating from A.M. Best Company. All policies (except for workers compensation) will show the District and the District (identified as Norridge School District No. 80, its Board of Education, and the Board's members, officers, employees, and agents) shall be named as an additional insured on a primary & non-contributory basis.
- E. The contractor shall present all certificates of insurance to the District with in thirty (30) days of the award of the bid, naming the District as an additional insured, and maintain current certificates of insurance throughout the term of this contact.
- F. All policies of insurance shall carry an endorsement to the effect that they cannot be modified, canceled or non-renewed without thirty (30) days written notice by certified or registered mail to the School District. Cancellation of any of the insurance policies required above, or the reduction of the amounts of liability insurance or medical coverage provided by such policies, shall be deemed a material breach of the contract and shall be cause for termination of the contract. Upon receipt of a notice of cancellation of any of the aforesaid insurance policies, or a reduction in the amount of coverage, the District shall have the option of terminating the contract, or paying the premiums necessary to continue the insurance policy at the required limits of liability and deduct the payment or payments from the compensation due the contactor under the contract. No policy shall reserve or permit any right to subrogation against the District, their officers, employees, students, and agents thereof.

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XVI. HOLD HARMLESS

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the contractor shall agree to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend The Board of the District, individual members thereof, and all officers, agents, and employees from and against all suit, actions, legal proceedings, claims and demands of every nature, and against all damages, liabilities, judgments, loses, costs, expenses, and attorney's fees resulting in any manner from acts or omissions, negligent or otherwise, of the contractor, its agents or employees, in performing or failing to perform any of the services, duties or operations to be performed by said contactor under the contract.

XVII. PERFORMANCE BOND

The District reserves the right to require, from the successful contractor, a performance bond covering each year of the contract in the amount of 100% of the yearly cost. Each bid must indicate the additional cost of such Bond. Each bid must be accompanied by a letter from an insurance company licensed in the State of Illinois with a Best Insurance Rating of at least A-10 indicating that the company will provide the specified performance bond for the bidder if desired.

XVIII. COMPENSATION

The contractor shall submit a claim for payment immediately following the last day of each month. Claims for payment shall be submitted to the District's Special Education Director in duplicate form, identifying individual student charges and monthly mileage.

All invoices will be paid in accordance with the Illinois Local Government Prompt Payment Act.
