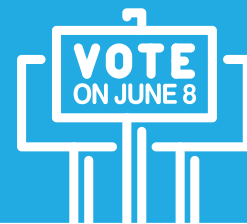


The 2021 Bond for Tulsa Public Schools is a \$414 million investment in Tulsa children, teachers, and families.



PROPOSITION 1: SAFE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS - \$166.8 MILLION

Proposition 1 will keep all of our schools and buildings safe, accessible, and in good repair by focusing on three key areas:

- » Building and space ADA-accessibility for all Tulsans;
- » Campus safety and security enhancements; and
- » Safe, welcoming, and joyful learning environments.



ADA-ACCESSIBLE BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS: \$14.7 MILLION

- » Exterior egress improvements;
- » Restroom accessibility modifications; and
- » Repairs and replacements for chair lifts and elevators as needed.



SAFETY AND SECURITY ENHANCEMENTS: \$30.5 MILLION



INTERIOR RENOVATIONS: \$44.1 MILLION



FURNITURE: \$7.5 MILLION

- » Funding for every school to replace their oldest furniture with more comfortable and adaptable school and classroom furniture.

KITCHEN CONSTRUCTION AND DINING ROOM UPGRADES: \$18.3 MILLION

- » Redesigning **all** senior high school cafeterias into flexible, multi-use spaces;
- » Replacing our oldest serving lines and kitchen equipment district-wide where needed; and
- » Providing walk-in freezer coolers at ten schools.

PROPOSITION 2: STUDENT AND CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY - \$90.7 MILLION

Proposition 2 ensures that **all** students and schools have the educational technology that 21st century learners need and deserve by:

- » Providing **every** student with the learning technology they need to be prepared for success in school and beyond;
- » Making technology improvements that improve communication between schools and families; and
- » Keeping our critical network systems operating securely.



TECHNOLOGY FOR TEACHING AND LEARNING: \$54.7 MILLION

- » Computing devices for **all** students, teachers, and support professionals; and
- » Enhanced classroom technology including interactive display boards, microphones, and more.



SCHOOL MARQUEE REPLACEMENT AND UPGRADES: \$1.9 MILLION

- » Digital marquees at **every** school, providing a highly visible and flexible method for schools to share information and updates with parents and families.



NETWORK, SYSTEMS, AND SECURITY UPGRADES: \$31.4 MILLION

PROPOSITION 3: TRANSPORTATION - \$17.3 MILLION

Proposition 3 will provide safe, comfortable, and environmentally sustainable transportation for every Tulsa student by:

- » Providing student transport vehicles to **every** high school for off-site learning and enrichment opportunities;
- » Improving student rider experiences with wifi-enabled activity buses and applications for parents to track bus arrival times; and
- » Funding our district's continued transition to environmentally-friendly buses using compressed natural gas.

Proposition 4 will invest in providing exceptional learning experiences for every child by focusing on five critical areas:

- » Creating strong STEM education, career- and college-ready programming;
- » Giving **all** Tulsa students the same opportunities to succeed;
- » Investing in our educators;
- » Nurturing the whole child with strengthened arts and athletics programs; and
- » Expanding access to early childhood education, dual language learning, and other proven initiatives.

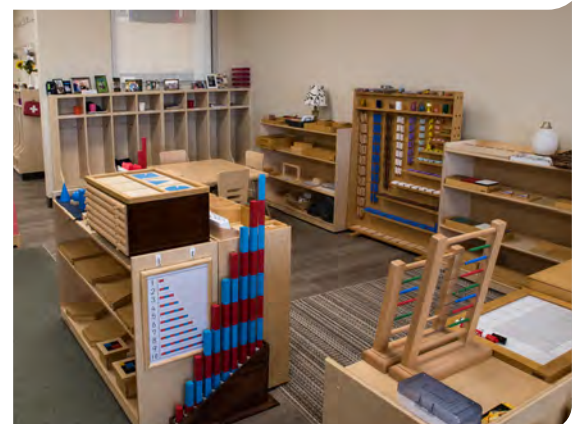

- » Expanding access to early childhood education programs for **every** Tulsa child; and
- » Improving school program offerings with additional Montessori and dual language schools.

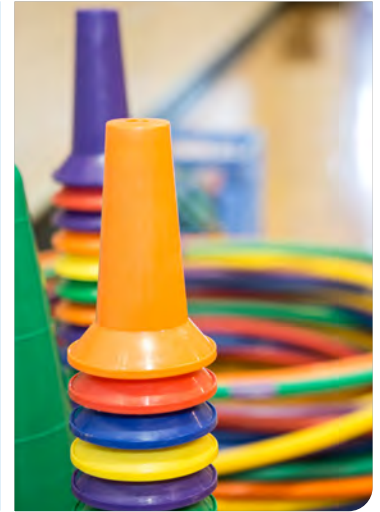

WELLNESS AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION: \$25 MILLION

Proposition 4 will improve student athletics and wellness programming and opportunities for every school:

- » Expanding access and equipping athletic programs at **all** middle schools;
- » Providing supplemental funds for physical education equipment budgets at **every** school; and
- » Investing in our secondary athletes with team uniforms for **every** school, football helmets and equipment, and sports medicine equipment.



IMPROVED OUTDOOR LEARNING AND PLAY AT EVERY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL: \$2.7 MILLION

- » Providing new playground structures at 13 elementary schools;
- » Creating outdoor learning spaces at 26 elementary schools; and
- » Building six ADA-accessible playgrounds for our special needs program sites.



FINE ARTS AND AUDITORIUM UPGRADES: \$9.6 MILLION

- » Fine arts equipment budgets for **every** school;
- » Equipment, instruments, and uniforms to support school programs and classes; and
- » District-wide auditorium improvements to stages, sound-systems, and lighting.
