- Official Transcript Student requests through their Parchment account



College Visits

How to schedule a college visit:

- Seniors are allowed two days for college visits.
- Contact the Admissions Office of the college you would like to visit.
- Go when classes are in session so you can talk with other students and staff.

Why visit the financial aid office?

 Visit the college financial aid office to find out about scholarships, deadlines, etc.

What we offer at the high school for students?

- College representatives visit our high school, so come visit with them.
 - Opportunity to learn about the college before you visit.
 - Dates are posted on the College and Career Center website under "Upcoming Events" and in the school's announcements.



Scholarships

Opportunities are listed on College and Career Center website as well as on a monthly scholarship list, which is emailed to parents and connect teachers.

- Write 1 or 2 essays
- Complete a resume (MCIS has a resume'!)
- Eligibility and criteria vary
- March and April tend to be the months with the most "local" scholarships.
- Stop in to the College & Career Center to discuss scholarship with Mr. Nangle.



Financial Aid

What is the FAFSA?

Free Application for Federal Student Aid

How do I apply?

- Starting October 1, you will be able to complete the application at <u>www.fafsa.gov</u>
- Use the FAFSA4caster to give you an early estimate about your application.
- The counseling office will be sponsoring a Financial Aid Night starting in September.
 - Staff from the Riverland Financial Aid Office will be here.
 - FAFSA completion opportunities will be offered October & November with experts on hand to help with the process.

College Expectations

Strength of Curriculum

- Take challenging courses your senior year!
- Take additional Math and Science!

Do NOT drop the rigor of your courses during your SENIOR year!

Continue to get good grades and improve your GPA

Admissions Process

Extra-curricular Involvement:

 Volunteer, get involved, take on leadership opportunities in areas of interest (sports, clubs, etc.)

ACT/SAT scores

- Some colleges have gone to self-reported grades & test scores (U of M Twin Cities STAR)
- Teacher/Counselor Recommendations remember to ask permission and complete a Student Brag Sheet.
- College Essays (make them memorable!)
- Academic Passion (for your future career)
- Personality (when an interview is required)



Applying to Colleges

- College applications are online. Some colleges might waive the application fee when done online. You can find the website of colleges in MCIS or by searching the internet, or visit Mr. Nangle in the Career Center.
- Once you have applied to a college, remember to request your transcript to be sent through MCIS/Parchment.
 - Transcripts are usually sent within 2 or 3 days of the request.
- Allow up to four weeks to hear from the college on your acceptance, possibly longer.

***DEADLINES – Be aware!!!!!!!!!!



The Common Application

- If you are applying to colleges using The Common Application:
 - Create an account
 - Complete steps in The Common Application
 - Complete a Student Brag Sheet for Letters of Recommendations and give to your counselor and teachers
 - 4. Link your counselor and teachers by adding them to your application.

***Keep in communication with your counselor regarding DEADLINES.



Timeline for Summer

- Visit campuses of your top-three college choices
- Begin to fill out college applications
- Volunteer
- Explore different career/college options www.iseek.org
- Start thinking about and do a rough draft of a college and scholarship essay. <u>PROOFREAD</u>
- Start thinking about financial aid how will you pay for school?
