"This is quite an honor as we have 95% of eligible high schools now participating in Unified Sports in Connecticut. Her commitment, dedication and enthusiasm with her students has risen her to the top of her peers."



#### According to information provided by the CIAC:

"Unified Sports is a registered program of Special Olympics that combines athletes with and without intellectual disability (or other developmental delays) on sports teams for training and competition. All Unified Sports teammates are of similar age and teams are placed in competitive divisions based on their skill abilities, and range from developmental to recreation al to competitive. In 1992, as part of an effort to reach school-aged athletes, Connecticut Special Olympics formed a partnership with the Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference to bring Unified Sports to Connecticut's schools."




#### Visual and Literary ARTS Awards:

# Boys Basketball Awards: Scholar Athlete - Cole Lavigne Sportsmanship Award - RJ Faria




