





ANIMAL PORTRAIT
LESSON 3
TONAL DRAWING

YOU WILL NEED:

RUBBER



PENCIL



**YOUR DRAWING FROM
LESSON 2**



**ANIMAL PICTURES WITH GRIDS
OVER THE TOP.**

Now we are going to continue drawing our tonal portraits of animals.

Just follow the instructions on the slides.



STEP 1

Using the grid carefully draw the outline of your chosen animal.

Remember draw the shapes you can see, one triangle at a time.

STEP 2

Using the grid add in the details, nose, mouth, eyes.

Don't guess use your grid!!





STEP 3

Very carefully and slowly rub out the lines of the grid.

Don't rub out you animal!

STEP 4

Over the whole picture shade in with a mid tone no 4 on the tonal scale.

Do not press hard.....keep your shading even and light.




Now it is time to get your drawing to look 3D.

Half close your eyes and look at the print out of your animal



Like this ?

No not like
that!!!!




Like this!

This will make the dark areas on your picture look darker.

It helps you work out where to shade in the darkest tones.



STEP 1. DARKEST TONES



Half close your eyes, look at the darkest areas.

Add in the darkest tones number **9** on the tonal scale.



STEP 2 TEXTURE

Now it is time to use lots of different tones and pencil marks to add texture to your drawing.

Texture shows the different surfaces on your animal.

Nose - Smooth, shiny

Whiskers- Straight, spikey

Fur- Long and wavy, short and spiky.



TEXTURE

Use different pencil marks to show different lengths of fur.



TEXTURE

Lots of short sharp pencil lines show short hairs around the eye.



STEP 3 LIGHTEST AREAS.

Half close your eyes again, look for the lightest areas.

Draw these areas in with your rubber.



DRAWING WITH YOUR RUBBER.

If you have a rectangular or square rubber you can draw with the edge to get a sharp line.



CLOSE UP.

Can see the lines drawn with a rubber?

These lines add texture and describe how the Lioness's fur moves.

Can you see the whiskers?




