


Felsted

You used the graduated tonal scale to shade in the middle tone, the darkest and lightest areas.


You added texture and detail and used your rubber to draw highlights.




Now you are an expert on tone......

ANIMAL PICTURES WITH GRIDS OVER THE TOP.

STEP 1.

Choose the picture you would like to draw, look carefully at the texture, shape and detail.


Draw out a grid on a piece of paper. To do this, follow the instructions on the following slides.


This will work best on an A3 piece of paper but an A4 will also work.



Drawing your grid


1. Draw diagonal lines from corner to corner.







2. Draw horizontal and vertical lines going through the center of the x







3. Draw a diamond shape



EAGLE


You will need to draw on your grid portrait way up.






PUPPY



Don't panic you can do it...........

Just follow the steps......slowly and carefully.

Put your grid flat in front of you

Landscape Or Portrait.

Now look very carefully at the picture you have chosen to draw.

Landscape



Using the grid carefully draw the outline of your chosen animal.

Remember draw the shapes you can see, one triangle at a time.



Using the grid add in the details, nose, mouth, eyes.

Don't guess, use your grid!!



Very carefully and slowly rub out the lines of the grid.

Don't rub out your animal!




Over the whole picture shade in with a mid tone no 4 on the tonal scale.

Do not press hard......keep your shading even and light.


Graduated Tonal Scale


