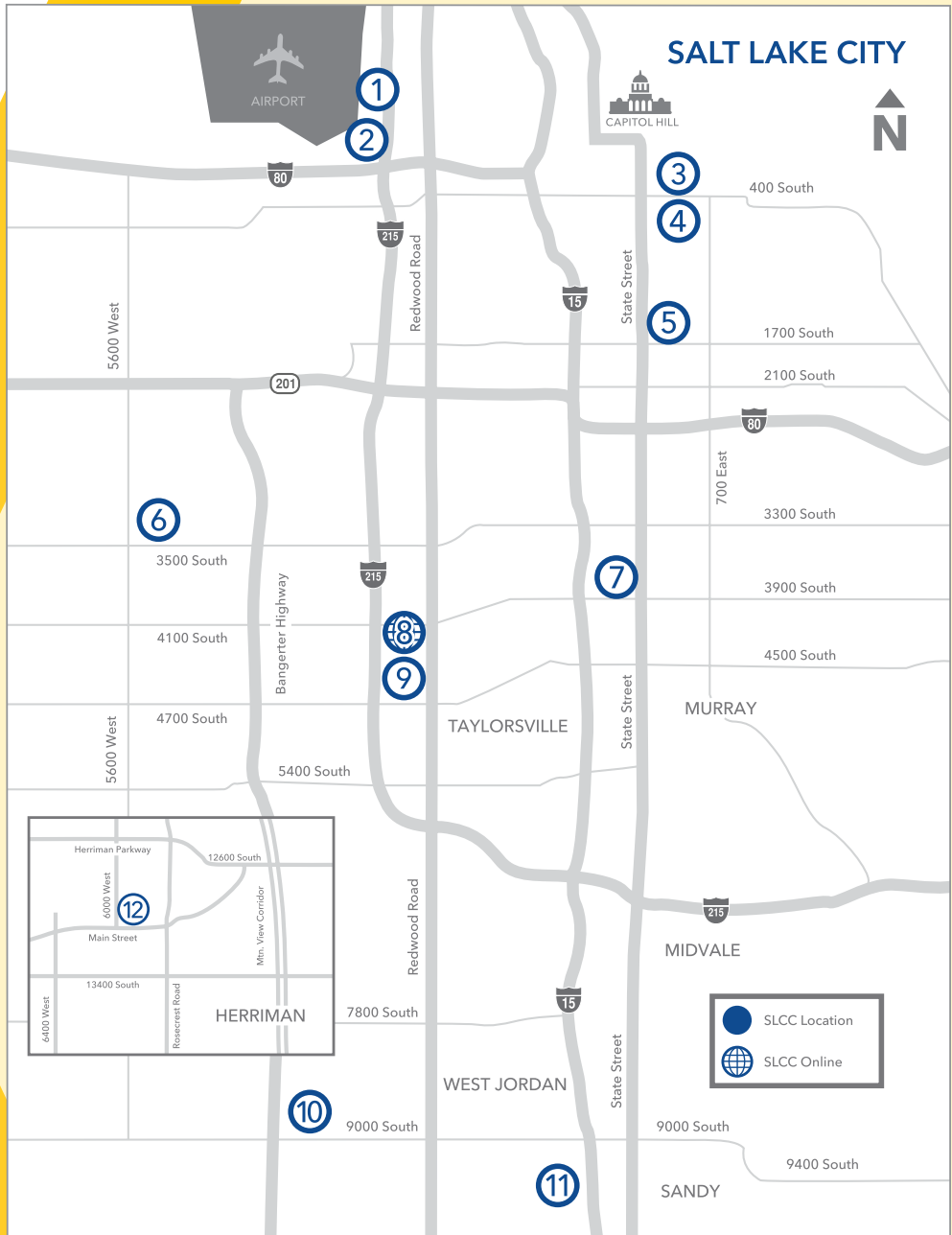

DEGREE OPTIONS

A

ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE (AS)

If you would like to complete your general education and prerequisite courses prior to transferring to a bachelor's degree at a Utah public four-year college or university, this path is for you. This is a great option for students who want to structure their major for a specific area of study.

ASSOCIATE OF ARTS (AA)

This degree choice is much like the AS degree with the addition of a foreign language requirement.

ASSOCIATE OF PRE-ENGINEERING (APE)

This is a specialized program to prepare you for transferring seamlessly into an engineering major at a Utah public four-year college or university. You will be required to complete a significant amount of engineering coursework, while taking fewer general education courses.

ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE (AAS)

If you're interested in a fast track toward an entry-level career, this choice is right for you. AAS degrees require more major-specific courses with fewer general education requirements.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION (CC)

This path will help you focus on a specialized field of study that quickly matches students to good-paying jobs that are in high demand in Utah.

CERTIFICATE OF PROFICIENCY (CP)

If you are already working in the field of your choice and you want an education to refine or improve your skills for a raise or promotion, this alternative may be right for you.

CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT (CA)

If you want to jump-start your career and get prepared for an entry-level job, you should investigate your options with this track.

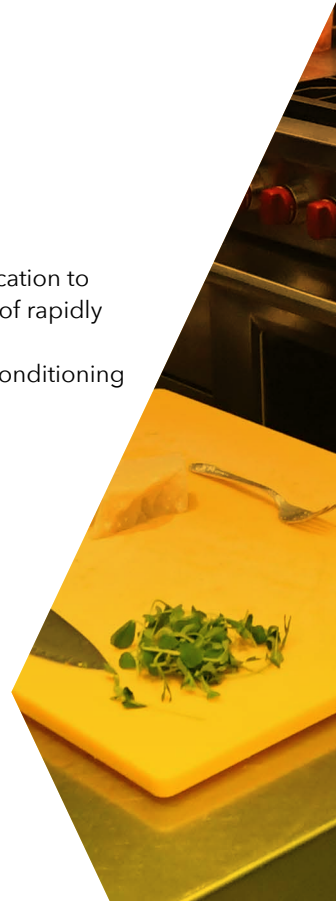

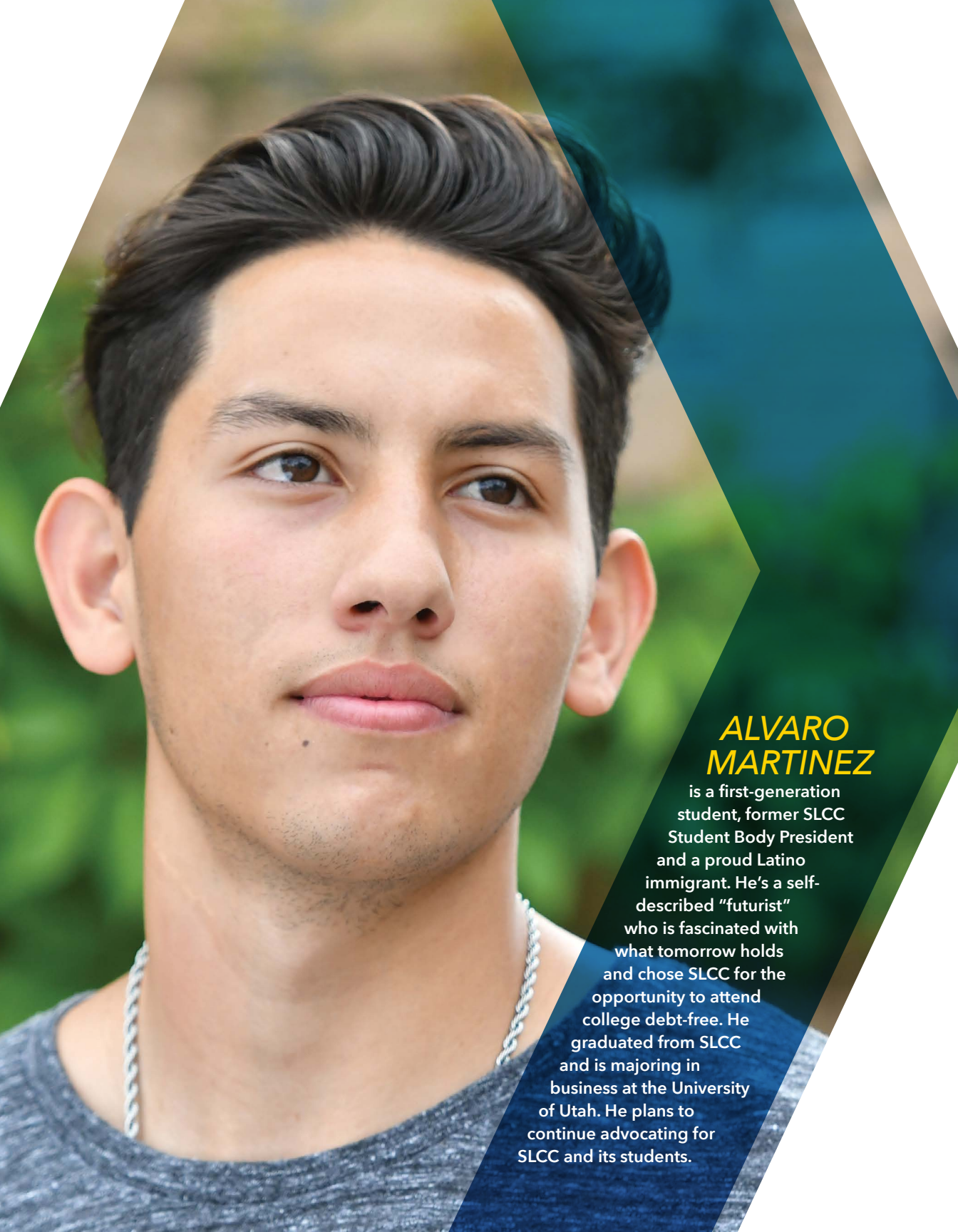
