- Students have an opportunity to earn college credit toward a postsecondary degree while also earning high school credit. Tuloso-Midway High School offers numerous college core curriculum as well as career and technology courses for students to consider.
- Students enrolled in dual credit courses “are” college students and must follow policies and procedures for adding and withdrawing from classes. In addition, they have the privilege of using the facilities including tutoring labs on the main campus.
- Students must meet course prerequisites and testing requirements for the course(s) requested.
- Students must be of junior standing with a minimum of 12 high school credits.
- Students must meet Assessment levels in Reading (R), English (E), and Mathematics (M) for the course(s) requested. (REM levels)
- Courses offered at Tuloso-Midway High School are offered either online (web-based) instruction and/or by TM/DMC credentialed teachers (adjunct) on the high school campus. Students taking online courses will be taught by college instructors and will be assisted daily by a TMHS teacher-facilitator five days a week.
- Students/Parents are responsible for course costs (see below) which are billed twice a year, a fall bill for semester 1 courses followed by a spring bill for semester 2 courses.
- Tuloso-Midway High School will provide books at no cost to students/parents.
- Submit proof of Meningitis vaccination
- Courses are weighted for GPA purposes.
- **Not** all dual credit courses are UIL exempt for “No Pass No Play” **of the following courses are not exempt:** technology applications, accounting, process technology, health science, business, CNA, and music courses: those may not be exclusive (may vary year to year).
- Qualified students may enroll in two courses per semester. However, students who qualify and maintain a 90 GPA may be allowed to register for three courses per semester. In addition, students who qualify and maintain a 95 GPA may be allowed to register for four courses per semester.
