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## THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education is committed to providing qualified applicants the opportunity to obtain a Salt Lake City School District-specific teaching license as they pursue their licensure through the Utah State Board of Education (USBE). A district-specific license, license area, or endorsement is only valid in Salt Lake City School District but will allow qualified applicants to work as a licensed educator in the district pursuant to various conditions required by USBE. Educators employed with a district-specific license shall receive educator training and support in accordance with applicable USBE rules.

The purpose of this policy is to identify the district's specific licensing/endorsement requirements pursuant to the conditions outlined by USBE, and to create a district LEA-specific license and/or endorsement.

The district has set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying [administrative procedures](#).
