HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Adults who have not yet earned a high school diploma may enroll into our diploma program to complete missing credits in order to meet our reduced credit requirement. Diploma classes are offered as independent study courses with the choice of attending online or in person at either Victor Valley High School or Adelanto High School. Upon completion the student will be issued a High School Diploma from Victor Valley Adult School.

GED PREP COURSE

VVAS GED prep courses are offered in an online/distance learning format. They are a hybrid of instructor led lessons and online coursework. Our GED prep course is designed to help improve skills in the four GED subject areas including English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies. Students will need to utilize their own devices and internet to access coursework and video meetings.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

Victor Valley Adult School offers English as a Second Language (ESL) courses in both beginner and intermediate levels. Students who complete the course are encouraged and guided to transition to Advanced ESL classes at Victor Valley College. Before placement in an ESL course the must take a CASAS test to determine placement level.

CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Victor Valley Adult School offers medical career training courses such as Medical Terminology and Medical Records and Billing. These are semester classes that are generally available for enrollment on our website in July and December for the upcoming semester. Please check our website for current available CTE courses.

CITIZENSHIP WORKSHOPS

Victor Valley Adult School has partnered with TODEC Legal Center to offer educational workshops throughout the school year. These workshops are conducted virtually. To sign up fill out the interest form on our website.

We will email you a link to log in to our next video workshop, which includes a question and answer portion. TODEC representatives are fluent in Spanish.



ENROLLMENT STEPS

1

Application: Please visit us at VVAS.VVUHS.D.ORG to fill out an online application for any of our programs. Within a few days of applying you will receive an email informing you of your status and if anything additional is required.

2

Transcripts: Needed for diploma program only. To order, reach out to the last high school you attended (unless it was within our district, VVUHS) to ask their procedure for ordering official transcripts. A fee may apply. **Official transcripts must be delivered to us in the original sealed envelope, marked official.**

3

Assessment: The state of California requires that all students take a CASAS assessment test prior to entry in to any adult education program and prior to exiting the program. The assessment helps the school place the student and allows the organization to assess student growth.

Get Your Schedule: Generally students will receive their schedule by email within one week of completing the enrollment process. The email will include a student email address and instructions to log in to online courses.
