## THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education encourages parents, authorized volunteers, and business partners to visit schools to participate in activities and attend events. While recognizing the positive impact that family and community involvement has on a student's success, the board's paramount concern is to provide a safe and inviting learning environment, in which disruptions to instructional time are minimized. To balance these concerns, processes are in place to identify school visitors and designate the time, place, and manner in which persons may visit schools.

The purpose of this policy is to enhance the safety of students, staff, and authorized visitors while maintaining a welcoming environment in the schools.

The district has set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying <u>administrative</u> <u>procedures</u>.

No district employee or student shall be subjected to discrimination in employment or any district program or activity on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, genetic information, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or veteran status.
