The <u>Food Research & Action Center</u> (FRAC) is pleased that the Biden administration has heeded our recommendation to expand the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Emergency Allotments during COVID-19. We applied the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) for taking action to improve food relief by providing \$1 billion per month in additional food assistance to SNAP participants, making the program more equitable for low-income households in need during the pandemic.
