News From the Principal

It is hard to believe that we are already at the end of the third quarter and preparing for our final classes of the 20-21 school year. We have some big changes ahead of us, as students will be returning to in-person learning four days per week starting March 30th. Please note that during the first week of the semester (March 15-19), students will still be attending two days per week in either their Tue/Wed or Thurs/Fri cohort.

Beginning on March 30th, we will be working to accommodate an increased number of students on our campus and in our classrooms at any given time. Please know that the things that were already important to keeping our students and staff safe and healthy during in-person learning are going to be even more important on March 30th. Please make sure that you check in with your student every morning and accurately fill out the COVID screening form, remind your students about the importance of social distancing, and encourage them to follow all guidelines around mask wearing. In addition, please consider accessing the COVID Check Colorado site at Centaurus for your student and family, as testing helps keep us safe and stay open. Please note that we will continue to implement focused quarantines as needed, and our overall goal is to keep students safe and keep our school open.

In Person Learning

With the district moving secondary students to Phase 4 - In Person Learning four days per week starting March 30, we know some families may wish to change their in person learning preference. Please complete this brief form by March 22nd to request a change from home learning to in person learning, or vice versa.

Please note: The only options for learning are home learning only or four days in person. Students attending in person learning are expected to attend classes onsite all four days.

Student Parking

Beginning March 30, we will have limited parking available due to the increase in attendance and COVID testing in the north lot. Student drivers (juniors and seniors permitted) will need a parking permit to park in the Centaurus lot. Please **print**, **complete**, **and bring this form** to the Treasurer's window during lunch or after 2:50pm along with required documentation (current driver's license, insurance card, and vehicle registration) to obtain your parking permit. Again, due to parking constraints, only juniors and seniors will be allowed to park on campus this spring.

Bell Schedule

After spring break we will have a new bell schedule with two lunch periods to accommodate the increase in students on campus. Watch for this update next week.

Water Bottles

All students should bring their own water bottle to school! Refill stations are available, but drinking fountains are closed. (Water bottles are no longer available onsite.)

Advisory Plan for March 17

Next week's advisory classes will include an Academic Check-in for all grade levels.

Advisory students will spend time checking their course grades and missing assignments. Students will go through a Pear Deck while teachers check in individually with each student.



BVSD launching COVID screening testing in schools after Spring Break



Dear BVSD Parents and Guardians.

As we continue to expand in-person learning opportunities in the Boulder Valley School District, including the move of secondary students to Phase 4 after Spring Break, we are continually looking for ways for us to strengthen our existing layers of protection. In the coming weeks, we are planning to add COVID screening testing to the outstanding system of health precautions already in place.

Per Public Health guidance, screening testing is valuable in areas with moderate to high levels of community transmission.

At moderate to substantial levels of community transmission, a random sample of at least 10% of students per week is recommended to reduce the likeliness of transmission within a school.

Starting on March 30, BVSD will begin weekly screening testing at participating BVSD schools. Ten percent of students at each school will be selected for testing every week. The schedule will be posted on our website here.


Screening testing will replace the current mobile testing site model. We will still be able to test BVSD individuals that are symptomatic/in quarantine. This testing would take place on days when screening testing is taking place at a site and would be outside of the building so that symptomatic/exposed individuals are not going inside.

Opt-in to random in-school testing to help reduce the spread of COVID-19 in our schools. What we need from you to opt-in:

- 1. If you have already opted in to BVSD mobile site testing, there is nothing further you need to do to give your consent for in-school screening testing. If you want to opt out of screening, contact legal@covidcheckcolorado.org.
- 2. Online opt-in: To opt your student/s in to BVSD in-school screening testing, follow these instructions.
- 3. Paper consent: To opt your student in to BVSD in-school screening testing, complete this form (English | Spanish). You can either bring this to your school signed or submit an electronic version to health.covid@bvsd.org. Have questions about screening testing? Sexual Violence Prevention Education

In case you missed it! The final parent presentations are coming up at the end of the month. Any parents still interested in attending are welcome to join!





Boulder Valley School District is partnering with Moving to End Sexual Assault (MESA) and Safehouse Progressive Alliance for Nonviolence (SPAN) to provide their sexual violence prevention curriculum, Peers Building Justice, to the 9th grade students. Prior to the student lessons, the staff at your child's school will be receiving training on sexual violence, mandatory reporting, and how to support a student that makes a disclosure.

Ninth graders will receive four lessons from the curriculum: Defining Relationships, The Cycle of Violence, Sexual Violence and Consent, and How to Support a Friend.

Preceding the student presentations, parents will be able to learn more information at the parent workshop. The workshop will cover information about sexual violence, the four lessons your child will receive, and tips to talking to your child about these topics.
