<p align="center">Approval of last Meeting's Minutes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The March minutes were approved with an 7-0 vote.
<p align="center">Financial Update</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Finances remain on track for the year. • The school lost one productivity that was funded through Land Trust money. • That money will be carried over into next year.
<p align="center">Academic Update</p>	<p>SIP Goals for 2021-22</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Next year's goals have been uploaded into the state website. <p>Summit Presentation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Summit is a learning management system (similar to Canvas) that allows school stakeholders 24/7 access to curriculum. • Mentoring class and check-ins were described. • Yearly view of the student pacing chart was explained (green, orange, red and blue colors were clarified along with pacing line) • Grading was described as a year-long process that builds upon itself. Summit measures cognitive skill growth over the entire year. • There was concern about students that are not on pace at the end the year...NDJH had implemented numerous interventions (mentoring groups, summer remediation, working lunch) to help students be successful. • Summit platform provides more time for teachers to give student feedback (less time is required for curriculum development). <p>Prelim 3rd Term Data</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are currently 596 F's (418 incompletes and 178 F's) for third term ... this number is down from 650 at the end of the term. • This number will continue to decrease as students work with administration and teachers to remediate grades. • Friday's (from 9:00 to 12:30) have been set aside for student remediation, where students needing help can visit teachers for additional support. • Counselors and teachers can invite students to attend Friday sessions. <p>SEL Survey Data</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The District is piloting a new program to track SEL Data (along with attendance, behavior and grades). • Students have taken survey, but data isn't available at this time. • Information should be available next month.

<p>Counseling Department</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Department’s interim district review begins today. • Counseling department is starting their 9th grade CCR’s this week. • CCR’s will be used as an exit meeting to help students transition to high school ... they will also allow counselors to address credit recovery needs.
<p>After-School Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School play (Spamalot Jr.) will open this week (Thurs - Sat.).
<p>PTA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PTA is preparing for teacher appreciation week at the beginning of next month.
<p>Other Items</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mr. Holbrook resigned from council at the conclusion of the year (he will no longer have students attending NDJH). • With term expirations, this will open up four new positions for the 2021-22 Community Council.
