Board considers policy for materials adoption

The instructional materials adoption policy is going through an overhaul. Assistant Superintendent Logan Toone told the Board of Education of the Davis School District to study the proposed changes over the next two weeks. Those proposals, he said, will be discussed in-depth during the next board workshop.

Among the changes are updates that allow for a variety of electronic materials. Additionally, school-level material adoption requirements have been added.

The board will discuss the policy changes during its regular workshop at 4 p.m., Tuesday, April 20. Possible adoption of the policy is scheduled for the regular board meeting on May 4.

In other business, the board approved:

• Replacement of stadium lighting for Bountiful High School. The lights were damaged in the September wind storm. B. Jackson Construction and Engineering bid \$512,400 to replace the lights. The lights will be replaced so that a future field update will not necessitate moving the lights.

• Hughes General Contractors will oversee the Viewmont High School track replacement. Carter said root damage and erosion necessitate the repairs. The bid for that project was just over \$1.2 million.

• Food lab refurbishment projects at Mueller Park Junior High and Syracuse High School. The winning bid submitted by Bailey Builders was for \$453,667.

• Hogan & Associates as the Construction Manager/General Contractor for the renovation of the HVAC system in the administration building. Business Administrator Craig Carter said the equipment is outdated and parts are no longer available.
