Hear My Story Project: Art

This half term, St Christopher's will be taking part in the Tate's new project called 'Hear My Story: Sharing Who We Are'. This topic allows the pupils to reflect and engage with their individual stories through art and across the curriculum. In art, the pupils have been encouraged to start learning more about their own family and its history, this may take the form of an interview with a family member, looking through photo albums or asking questions. We will be encouraging them to start collecting resources, such as copies of photographs, ideas, stories or making pictures of their memories, all of which can be used to create a piece of art. On our return to school, we ask that the girls bring in their resources, which can then be quarantined before use.
