Children's House Explorers

For three year olds

This program comes highly recommended by parents and teachers alike. Geared to helping children transition from a toddler program to pre-K and kindergarten, campers in the Children's House Explorers sessions build skills, independence, and confidence in an environment rich with age-appropriate experiences like small and large motor works, cutting, painting, matching, sorting, science and many of the Montessori sensorial materials. Campers practice grace and courtesy, sitting at the meeting, playing on our bigger playground, follow-through (putting works away), and toileting. This camp offers a smooth transition to Children's House classes for our MSR families and for any child moving from daycare to pre-kindergarten in the fall. Each session is limited to an enrollment of 12 children.

Math Enrichment Summer Program

Does your student have an affinity for Math? Does your student want to continue growing their hard-earned Math skills during the Summer? Does your student want to get ahead and be prepared for the challenges they will face next year during Math? If you or your student answer yes to any of these questions then you should sign up for MSR's Math Enrichment Summer Program. Students in this enrichment program will strengthen and stretch their math skills during the summer.

This is a low-stress way for students to work with MSR teachers once a week in a relaxed summer environment. Students will be able to work on concepts during the two-hour time frame, getting direct instruction and practicing previously taught skills. At the end of each session, students will have work to take home to continue reinforcing the skills that were reviewed. This work can be completed by the student and brought back for review the following week.

The schedule for the summer is flexible to the needs of the student and the family. MSR will provide two hours of instruction from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM on Thursday. Students do not need to be able to attend every Thursday session to participate.
