PARENT VUE

- ▶ Current HPS Students: Parent Vue access will not be available until the annual “system rollover” which does not take place until later this summer.
- ▶ New parents will enroll and receive their activation codes. This is how you will enroll your student into HPS.
- ▶ It is important that once you are provided with your Parent Vue access, you set up your account and keep track of your user name and password!
