The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services has declared eligibility of individuals age 16 and up to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, and we have exciting news for all DCS students who fall in this category. Davie County Schools has been approved to offer a Student Vaccination Clinic this Wednesday, April 28 from 10:00am-12:00pm in the Davie County High School parking lot. Davie County Schools has partnered with the Davie County Department of Health and Human Services (DCDHHS) to offer the Pfizer vaccine for our students ages 16 and up. DCDHHS is not sure how many vaccines we will receive, and has said to expect limited supply. Therefore, vaccines will be given on a first come, first serve basis.

Student who would like to receive the vaccine must provide the following on the day of the clinic:

- Valid form of Identification required at check in on April 28. ID MUST include date of birth.
- Registration paperwork must be completed and turned in at check in on April 28.
- Please note, all students under age 18 must have a consent form, signed by their parent or legal guardian.

The required registration paperwork is available on [GoDavie.org on the Families page](https://www.davie.org/families). If you do not have a way to print the required documents, please visit the front office of Davie County High School or Davie County Early College High School to pick up a copy starting Monday, April 26. The second vaccine for this clinic will be given on Wednesday, May 19, 2021. The quick turnaround for the first dose in this clinic helps us avoid conflict with the second dose and final exams for students.

We are pleased to offer this opportunity for our students and hope it makes receiving the vaccine a little easier and more convenient. We are committed to protecting the health and well-being of our students for both this year and the upcoming school year.
