- Welcome by Lisa Wood. A motion to approve minutes for March was made by Malia Roundy, seconded by Lisa Wood and approved by all voting members including Lisa Wood, Malia Roundy, Jennifer Matthews, Sara Lundberg, Jennifer Coyle, Kent Brown, and Michael Martini.
- **Mr. Brown Counselor** reports registration has been completed for all incoming grades and turned over to the administration to create the master schedule. The Councilors held an honor social and 676 students were honored. Most notable was the students that showed improvement from the term before. The Counselling office recently completed a district and state audit, which occurs every three years. They did a great job.
- **Mrs. Coyle: JSSC reports** that Aspire and Rise testing are in progress. Teachers are continuing Lean Training in PLCs with Julie Laub. Most feel this training is helpful, supportive, and positive.
- Mr. Martini's review of School Improvement Plan Goals and Budget included a summary of last year's goals and a proposal of this year's goals and how funds (Land Trust, TSSA) tie to these goals. Some Challenges this year have been communicating through canvas and implementing 1 to 1 technology, Goals for the coming year.
 - 1. Increase passing rates: In each grade.
 - 2. College and Career Readiness: Increase Student's higher-level thinking through questioning, solving real-world problems, and critically analyzing information as evidenced by increased Evaluate Davis observation rates in T 5 from 2.61 to 2.8.
 - 3. ESL; Empower student learning; Strengthen social emotional skills to improve learning for all students in the core areas by increasing reading proficiency as demonstrated by a 2% average growth on the Reading Inventory, with particular attention given to those students served under the Individual Education Plan (IEP) and identified on the TSI report. Sara Lundberg motioned to approve the School Plan and Jennifer Matthews seconded the motion. All voting members present approved.
