From the Desk of Your Superintendent

What a difference a year makes. Last year as I sat to write that newsletter, we had recently closed our school buildings, we were just starting to learn more about COVID-19, we were adjusting everything in our daily lives, businesses were closed, and everything felt way out of sorts. A year later, we have learned a lot about the pandemic and have made many adjustments to our social, personal, and professional lives.

Over the course of the last year we have seen a lot of changes in schools - spacing between seats in classrooms, remote learning, seating charts on buses, socially distanced lunches and recesses, wearing of face coverings, using plexiglass dividers, extra cleaning and sanitizing, the list goes on. With all of the changes, the one thing I will say is that I am very proud of the fact that everyone has done everything possible to help us keep our school buildings open for us to be able to have face-to-face instruction from the beginning of the school year. As you have seen and heard, many school buildings all over the country did not open for face-to-face instruction and conducted learning remotely or through a hybrid model well into the spring months. It is a testament to everyone - school staff, students, families, and the community - that we have been able to do what we have done. THANK YOU!

Another exciting thing for us is that summer school will return in as normal of a way as possible. We will still have to implement some risk mitigation measures, but at least students will be able to have summer opportunities that they were unable to have last year. We will again offer classes at the elementary, middle school and high school levels. We will also be offering the summer swim lesson program again this year. By now you have already signed your children up for these opportunities and we hope that you and your children will enjoy the opportunities being offered.

As we start to close out the 2020-2021 school year we are well into planning for next year. While we hope things feel far more normal as we move toward the 2021-2022 school year, we know that we will still need to be aware of potential changes and needs to continue to keep our students and staff safe. One of the things we do know is that we will be offering in-person instruction in as normal of a way as possible. The Board has discussed and is in full support of having all students physically present for their instruction next year and not having a remote option for next school year. Again, as we plan forward, we know we will still need to take some precautions, but we hope that we will be in a more normal place when we open our school buildings for the 2021-2022 school year.

I want to close by saying congratulations to the Class of 2021. You certainly had some very unique experiences during the end of your Junior year and throughout your Senior year. While there many things that were different and even some opportunities that were lost, hopefully that are some lessons that were learned along the way that will serve you well in your adult lives. While your high school experience has come to a close, it is not an ending, but a new beginning. Some of you are off to college, some are off to the workforce,

Un año después, hemos aprendido mucho sobre la pandemia y hemos hecho muchos ajustes en nuestra vida social, personal y profesional.


En el transcurso del último año hemos visto muchos cambios en las escuelas: espacio entre asientos en los salones de clase, aprendizaje a distancia, asignación de asientos en los autobuses, almuerzos y recreos socialmente distanciados, uso de cubrebocas, uso de separadores de plexiglás, limpieza e higienización adicionales, y la lista continúa. Con todos los cambios, lo único que diré es que estoy muy orgulloso de que todos hayan hecho todo lo posible para ayudarnos a mantener nuestros edificios escolares abiertos para que podamos tener instrucción presencial desde el comienzo del año escolar. Como han visto y escuchado, muchos edificios escolares de todo el país no abrieron para la enseñanza en persona y llevaron a cabo el aprendizaje a distancia o a través de un modelo híbrido hasta bien entrados los meses de primavera. Es un testimonio de todos -el personal de la escuela, los estudiantes, las familias y la comunidad- que hemos sido capaces de hacer lo que hemos hecho. ¡GRACIAS!

Otra cosa emocionante para nosotros es que la escuela de verano volverá de la forma más normal posible. Todavía tendremos que aplicar algunas medidas para mitigar los riesgos, pero al menos los estudiantes podrán tener las oportunidades de verano que no pudieron tener el año pasado. Volveremos a ofrecer clases en la primaria, secundaria y preparatoria. Además, este año volveremos a ofrecer el programa de clases de natación de verano. A estas alturas ya habrán inscrito a sus hijos para participar en estas oportunidades y esperamos que ustedes y sus hijos disfruten de las oportunidades que se ofrecen.

A medida que comenzamos a cerrar el año escolar 2020-2021 estamos en plena planificación para el próximo año. Aunque esperamos que las cosas se sientan mucho más normales a medida que avanzamos hacia el año escolar 2021-2022, sabemos que todavía tendremos que ser conscientes de los posibles cambios y necesidades para seguir manteniendo a nuestros estudiantes y personal seguros. The following are the minimum required immunizations for each age/grade level. It is not a recommended immunization schedule for infants and preschoolers. For that schedule, contact your doctor or local health department.

² DTP/DTaP/DT/Td vaccine for students entering PreK grades 1 through 12: Four doses are required. However, if your child received the 3rd dose after the 4th birthday, further doses are not required. (Note: A dose 4 days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable.)

³ Tdap means adolescent tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis vaccine. If your child received a dose of a tetanus-containing virus vaccine, such as Td, within 5 years of entering the grade in which Tdap is required, your child is compliant, and a dose of Tdap vaccine is not required.

⁴ Polio vaccine for students entering grades Kindergarten through 12: Four doses are required. However, if your child received the 3rd dose after the 4th birthday, further doses are not required. (Note: A dose 4 days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable.)

⁵ The first dose of MMR vaccine must have been received on or after the first birthday. (Note: A dose 4 days or less before the 1st birthday is also acceptable.)

⁶ Var means Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. A history of chickenpox disease is also acceptable.
