Class Assignments

- The teacher your child will have next year won't be determined until this summer. You'll get registration information in late July with details about the Parent Portal and how to access your child's classroom assignment.
- We are hoping there will be an opportunity for families new to Jefferson to visit the building and meet some staff members later this spring, but like many things right now, we are uncertain if this will be possible.

Attendance Exceptions

- If you do not live in the Jefferson attendance area, your child may only attend here if you meet one of the following three criteria:
 - Your child goes to daycare within the Jefferson attendance area. (If you live in the East attendance area, when your child finishes 5th grade he or she will attend Middle School at PWMS)
 - You move, or become homeless, DURING the school year, and you want your child to finish the year at Jefferson. (only valid for the remainder of that school year)
 - You have a child with documented special needs that warrant attendance here. (this is a very rare circumstance)

Registration Process

- If your child is registered, you will receive communication from us in July inviting you to sign up online for entrance conferences.
- If you child is not yet registered:
 Central Registration is open by appointment only since we can only have 4 people in our office at this time.
 If a family needs help with registration, they should call Central Registration (507) 387-1868 and we will either make an appointment to do the registration over the phone or we will schedule an appointment for them to come into the Central Registration office.
- The following MUST BE ON FILE AT CENTRAL REGISTRATION (10 Civic Center Plaza):
 - Copy of official birth certificate
 - Current immunization form
 - Completed Early Childhood Screening

How can you help your child be successful?

- Value school attendance
- Build excitement for learning
- Read to / with your child daily (30 mins.)
- Consistent bedtimes allowing for plenty of sleep
- Good breakfast
- MUST be toilet trained
- Communicate concerns to the teacher
- Visit with the principal
- Teach him/her to tie shoes! (if not, VELCRO)
- Encourage independence (i.e. go to breakfast on their own, walk to the classroom on their own, etc).

Our Priorities

- The safety of your children is of utmost importance to us.
- We take teaching and learning very seriously, and our kindergarten teachers have very high expectations for ALL children.
- We teach children to be responsible for their learning and their behavior.
- We teach children self-regulation, especially for behaviors and emotions on a daily basis.

End Of The Year Goals

Reading

- Students will know their letter names and letter sounds.
- Students will read at least 60 minutes throughout the school day every day. They will be learning sight words and how to read real books.
- Sit and read independently for 30 minutes.
- Students will have to be able to answer basic comprehension questions about many different books.

Math

- They will be able count, read, write, and show numbers to 31. Count backwards from 20.
- 2-D and 3-D shapes
- Add and Subtract numbers through 10
- Complete, extend, and name patterns
- Measure and compare objects (shorter/taller, heavy/light, big/small)

End Of The Year Goals

Writing

- Students will write all uppercase and lowercase letters (top to bottom formation)
- Students will write 1 to 3 sentences in a journal about different topics.
- Students will spell simple words by saying the sounds in words and writing the letter for that sound.

Behavior/Social

- Students are expected to share and use kind words with friends
- Use words to independently problem solve
- Be willing to work with all classmates
- Sit at the carpet for 10-15 minutes at a time
- Focus on an activity for 15-20 minutes
- Be independent for routine activities (putting shoes on, zipping coat, opening milk cartons, or asking for help)
