This has been a year of change unlike any other we have ever experienced. As we near the end of this year, I would like to hear about your experiences with your student's education. In the next day or so, I will send you a link to a survey which will include questions about your student's learning, school safety, and interpersonal relationships as well as your attitudes about the school environment and your involvement. Your responses will be very helpful in shaping our constant need to improve learning conditions in our schools.

This survey is run by the Utah State Board of Education and I highly support this endeavor. This is your time to give us your ideas while providing us with valuable information. You will have until May 28th to complete the survey, but I urge you not to wait and fill it out. It should take no more than 6 minutes of your time.

In addition to parent surveys, we will also be administering student surveys during school time. Like the parent survey, student surveys are confidential and used to identify issues within our school. The survey takes no more than 6 minutes of their time as well. Once identified, school staff will use these results to lobby for those needed changes.

These surveys are important to our school and to the Utah State Board of Education and will be given as part of the school day. If you would prefer your student not take the survey, Optout forms will be made available by email or a paper copy will be available in the office.

Again, I encourage you to watch for the separate email coming home soon for the link for the parent survey which will be sent out shortly.

Dress-Code Policy

As we move into warmer weather, please take a moment to review our dress-code policy.

HAIR

All students who attend Centerville Elementary School should wear their hair in a clean and well-groomed manner that is not distracting to the learning environment. Extreme hairstyles or colors are prohibited.

CLOTHING

- ✓ Extreme or slovenly clothing, including but not limited to, baggy or "sagging" pants or shorts, excessively oversized jackets or coats, inappropriately short or tight or revealing shorts, skirts, dresses, shirts, etc.: and clothing that is torn, ripped or frayed are prohibited.
- ✓ Bare or stocking feet are prohibited
- ✓ Clothing which displays obscene, vulgar, lewd, or sexually explicit words, messages, or pictures
- ✓ Hats and bandanna are prohibited. Students are not allowed to cover their heads while in the building. Exceptions may exist with school permission.
- ✓ Clothing shall cover the student's entire upper torso. All shirts, tops and dresses are required to have sleeves. Clothing that exposes bare midriffs, buttocks, or undergarments are not allowed. Tank tops or spaghetti strapped shirts are not allowed.
- ✓ Clothing that advertises a substance a student cannot legally possess or use (i.e., tobacco, alcohol, illegal drugs).
- ✓ Flip-flops, platforms, or any shoes which make it difficult for students to engage in vigorous play are <u>strongly discouraged</u>. Heelies or any shoes with wheels or that can be used with wheels are not allowed on school grounds.

At various times throughout the year, school administration may permit students to wear certain types of clothing for health or safety reasons or in connection with certain specialized school-sponsored activities and events.

Students who violate the dress code will be asked to correct the problem and will be required to review the school dress code. If continued problems occur, parents will be notified again and asked to bring their student clothes that do not violate the dress code. If a parent cannot be reached, students will be provided clothes that follow the dress-code policy.
