Math Placement

- Three levels of Math 6
 - Math 6 → Pre-Alg in 8th Grade
 - Math 6 Accelerated → Alg in 8th Grade
 - Math 6 Honors → Geo in 8th Grade
- Placement is determined by STAR & Terra Nova Testing, along with teacher input
- Placement letters mailed home in early July
- Teachers will evaluate placements as the year gets started. We will conduct a formal review of placements in January to ensure proper placements.






Cell Phones @ WO
