Board Briefs from School Board Meeting Nov. 23, 2020, Board Briefs are a communication tool designed to highlight important conversations and decisions made on behalf of students, families, staff, and the larger community by the District 70 School Board at each monthly School Board meeting.

Reopening Discussion and Update

During the board meeting Supt. Dr. Matt Barbini recommended that Libertyville School District 70 students and teachers take a proactive preventative pause from in-person learning after Winter Break, from Jan. 5, 2021, through to Jan. 19, 2021, starting in-person school then on Jan. 20, 2021. Students will do remote learning during those two weeks. eSchool Centers will remain open, administrators and nurses will be in the schools and the ERC during these two weeks as well. The board gave a vote of confidence to Supt. Barbini's recommendation by a vote of 5-2 vote with a caveat of revisiting the recommendation should there be changes on the local, state, or federal level.

Superintendent's Report

Board Member Mrs. Balanag

During Monday's school board meeting we welcomed and new board member Angela K. Balanag, a Libertyville resident and Copeland Manor parent, who took the Oath of Office as a new school board member.

Balanag, 47, will serve until the April 6 Consolidated Elections, completing the term of Linda Lucke, who resigned after moving out of District 70 boundaries. An English teacher at Grant Community High School, Balanag noted in her application that, "I am an educator who is passionate about equity. I think all students, staff, faculty, administrators, parents, and community members deserve high-quality opportunities to grow."

With a master's degree in school leadership from Northeastern Illinois University and a master's degree in English and teaching and learning from DePaul University, Balanag first majored in mass communications and history at Illinois State University. She worked as a professional broadcaster while working on her bachelor's degree.

"I have great respect for public service and the role of the community in public education," Balanag said. "I recognize the high-quality decision-making process of the staff, faculty, administration, and board of education that District 70 engages in. It would be an honor to serve the community for a few months."

She began her education career as a substitute teacher in Community District 128 (LHS) and Waukegan Community School District 60. She also has taught at Antioch Community High School and served two years as the head coach of the Boys Bowling Team at Grant Community High School.

Balanag and her husband, Edgar, have a daughter, Vivian.

New Board President Mrs. Schilling, New Vice President Marc Grote

Veteran Board of Education member Wendy Schilling took on the role of board president at the school board meeting Monday night, replacing board member Tom Vickers. Vickers stepped down from his board position due to heavy work obligations but he will remain on the board to complete his third four-year term.

We thank Mr. Vickers for his dedicated and selfless leadership as president and look forward to continuing working with him on the board.

We also are grateful for Mrs. Schilling, a veteran board member serving on her second fouryear term, who is graciously stepping into the president's role.
