Principal's Corner

Dear Westview Families,

Ten years ago on Friday, May 27, 2011, I received a phone call that changed a direction in my life. I was home on a personal day for my stepdaughter's wedding. My kitchen was full with her, her best friend, my two other girls and husband. We were having breakfast, going over the list of things to finish, gathering buckets for the flowers we were picking up in St. Paul and settling some nerves. My phone rang and seeing it was the superintendent, I stepped onto the deck for privacy and quiet. After some clarification and small talk about being at home and events of the day, I was asked, "Would you like to be the next principal at Westview Elementary?" While I was hoping for this outcome, I was not expecting it, already had a range of emotions playing out around the wedding and am not always a fast processor with big decisions. I trusted all my previous thoughts about this opportunity and answered a positive, "yes!" I was told that I would be introduced to the Westview staff before the school day on Tuesday and that someone would announce to the Glacier Hills staff at the same time that I was accepting a new role. I remember thinking about what to wear, who was on the hiring committee from the school and other connections I could make or what I might say. I entered the building a bit shaky, doubting if I was ready for this next step, worried about change to a new community, leaving a place where I felt safe and successful and feeling vulnerable yet excited. As I reflect over the past decade, I am so grateful to be in place where students are genuinely cared for as a whole person by a dedicated staff. I appreciate the faith, trust and partnership with our parents. Especially, leading and learning together

during this year has solidified that saying yes to Westview has deeply impacted me forever. I look forward to more time together on the journey as we continue to build a safe, rigorous, relevant learning environment with relationships at the core.
