Reports

- Christina Guigiere presented report on LCAP from district. She asked council to fill out LCAP survey if not done so already. She described the LCAP as a 3 year plan all schools complete in California. This one will be for 2021-2024. The LCAP outlines our district's plan on expenses/budget. It is a strategic planning for the budged and everyone's input is valuable. LUSD has 66% unduplicated students which allocates additional funding. We have approximately 95 million in funds with additional funds allocated due to COVID/pandemic (CARES, etc.) Goal #1 is to maximize student achievement, goal #2 is effective stakeholder engagement, goal #3 is to develop staff capacity and goal #4 is to provide a safe & respectful environment. The district is requesting recommendation for staff, and families to complete the survey in order to improve the LCAP plan.

- Rob Morey asked if the links for surveys are on the district website, Guigiere responded yes, they are available to fill out by 4/16/2021

New business

- Mark Swanitz discussed how the state waived CAASP testing (Eng/Math) and mentioned we are waiting on hearing about status of science testing. We will continue to give STAR test for 9th/10th which opens on the 19th of April.
Reopening update given: balanced cohorts, counselors were busy week before finals and completed requests for cohort changes, and track changes 100%. CHS is no longer accommodating requests for track/cohort changes due to being half way through grading period. There have been no cases (COVID) as a result of re-opening. Football team was quarantined but no evidence of spread/outbreak or additional issues since. There is a possibility of reopening in full August of 2021-2022.
- Stacey gray asked if there was a possibility of continued distance learning next school year. Mark Swanitz replied yes there is a possibility of an academy but sports/athletes creates a possible issue if done as a district wide program, however there will likely be some positive changes that arise out of what we have learned.
- Kiara Ricci commented she is distance learning and it is working for her.
- Mark Swanitz gave a graduation update. A survey was sent out to seniors and parents. There are some limitations if we remain in red tier. This could mean streaming option or 25% capacity in person or drive through options could be used. Graduation may also take place at Huyck Stadium to allow more guests per student. There is even an am/pm graduation possibility. All options and final status depend on what tier we are in.
- Kiara Ricci asked “if we do drive through, how will speeches be handled?”. Mark Swanitz replied they will be pre-recorded and posted to You Tube. Senior awards will also be via zoom and with use of new technology to view different presentations on stage live and on zoom.
