The 2021 Bond for Tulsa Public Schools will bring some exciting changes for students, teachers, and support professionals at Hale High School! The proposed bond package includes:

 Replacement of the school's practice field turf, and athletic equipment and uniforms for students.

- » Redesigning the cafeteria into a flexible, comfortable, multi-use space for students, teachers, and support professionals;
- » Upgrades to the auditorium lighting and sound system, new stage curtains, and repainting;
- » ADA-accessibility improvements in school restrooms and at building exits;
- » Parking lot resurfacing and improvements to exterior lighting; and
- » Remodels for the school's science labs and investments in STEM equipment.



The 2021 Bond will also fund an indoor soccer facility and practice gym for our student athletes. This new space will be available for district and community teams to schedule and use outside of the school day. In addition to locker rooms and athletic practice and training spaces, the facility will include a student union space for Hale students to safely gather for academic and social activities.

## TOTAL INVESTMENT IN HALE HIGH SCHOOL: \$17.8 MILLION

### PROPOSITION 1: SAFE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS - \$4.8 MILLION

- » Security cameras and radios
- » Safe entry and door access control
- » Accessibility building improvements
- » Parking lot, sidewalk, and exterior LED lighting
- » Dining/kitchen improvements
- » School and classroom furniture
- » Full replacement of the HVAC system support by CARES Act federal funding

### PROPOSITION 2: STUDENT AND CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY - \$2.6 MILLION

- » Network and systems upgrades
- » Student and teacher technology
- » Digital marquee

### PROPOSITION 3: TRANSPORTATION

- » Funding from Proposition 3 will ensure that all students have access to safe, comfortable, and dependable transportation.

### PROPOSITION 4: QUALITY LEARNING MATERIALS AND PROGRAMS - \$10.4 MILLION

- » Textbooks and learning materials
- » Fine arts and auditorium upgrades
- » Library digital and print resources
- » STEM lab upgrades
- » School projects funds
- » Wellness and physical education

Project totals are estimates and will be adjusted to ensure projects are completed. Totals based on pupil count will be adjusted to reflect current enrollment.
