HEALTH AND SAFETY EXPECTATIONS: Our Community Norms

Steps to MINIMIZE COVID-19 ENTERING CAMPUS



Consistently FOLLOW STATE AND LOCAL GUIDELINES at school and when away from campus.



QUARANTINE FOR 10 DAYS after traveling out of state or country *if you are not vaccinated*. All international travelers must follow CDC testing guidance. Per LA County Public Health guidelines, non-essential out-of-state travel should be avoided.



SUBMIT MYMEDBOT SELF-SCREENING

for COVID-19 symptoms each morning one hour before coming to campus.



TAKE WEEKLY SURVEILLANCE/ ASYMPTOMATIC PCR TEST.

We will continue to evaluate our testing program and health department testing guidance. (See www.westridge.org/return-tocampus-forms for the most up-todate information and schedule for testing requirements.)

FOLLOW NO-VISITOR POLICY

Parents may only enter campus to pick up a child who has become sick or for Help Desk appointments.

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Steps to minimizing Spread of Covid-19



MASKS

Students and adults are required to wear a well-fitting, 2-ply masks at all times (3-ply recommended). The school will maintain a stock of masks in case a replacement is required during the day.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING

Students and faculty and staff will maintain a safe distance of 6 feet between people. Classrooms and other campus locations have been wholly reconfigured to meet this requirement. When possible, car-line arrival and dismissal times will be staggered to minimize periods of highdensity foot traffic.

LIMIT SHARED MATERIALS

Sharing of classroom materials will be minimized, and hand and material sanitation will be practiced when it is necessary. Some outdoor equipment will be shared, however, it will be sanitized between uses.

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Student Protocols STEPS TO MINIMIZING SPREAD OF COVID-19

Handwashing and sanitizing

Handwashing stations and no-touch hand sanitizer stations have been placed throughout campus. All students will be required to sanitize their hands when entering and exiting campus, and often throughout the day. In addition to indoor bathrooms available for handwashing:

3 OUTDOOR HANDWASHING STATIONS have been installed.

50 HAND SANITIZING STATIONS have been placed across campus. Bottles of **HAND SANITIZER AND DISINFECTANT WIPES** are available in all classrooms.



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Campus Protocols STEPS TO MINIMIZING SPREAD OF COVID-19

Illness Policies and Contact Tracing

STUDENT ILLNESS

- Students who have a fever of 100° F or above or present with COVID-19 related symptoms will not be allowed to come to campus.
- Students who develop a fever and cough during the school day, or other symptoms consistent with COVID-19, will be moved to an isolation area and will be picked up by a parent or guardian as soon as possible.

- A nurse will be on campus at all times when students are present.
- Students who have been ill may return to school following a fever or any COVID-19 symptoms if they are:
 - fever-free without fever reducing medication, for 24 hours; AND
 - symptoms have improved; AND
 - 10 days since their symptoms began or, if asymptomatic, since their positive COVID-19 test.

Campus Protocols STEPS TO MINIMIZING SPREAD OF COVID-19

Illness Policies and Contact Tracing

COVID-19 EXPOSURE

Any student who has been in contact with a person with a confirmed case of COVID also will not be able to come to campus until taking a COVID-19 test:


- If they test negative, they must complete a 10-day quarantine period as well as selfmonitor days 11-14 for symptoms.
- If they test positive, they need to follow CDC guidelines for isolation.

CONTACT TRACING

The school has four trained contact tracers on staff who will initiate contact tracing protocols for any documented or presumed positive COVID-19 case on campus. Parents and guardians will be contacted if their child was potentially exposed.

STABLE GROUP QUARANTINE PROCEDURES

Stable groups will shift to remote learning and be required to quarantine at home if a positive case of COVID-19 is found in any member of the group, including the teacher.





Facilities Modifications Steps to minimizing Spread of Covid-19

HVAC AIR FILTERS

All filters have been upgraded to be compliant with EPA COVID-19 recommendations.

AIR-SCRUBBER SYSTEM

An Absorptive Photocatalytic Oxidation (APCO) with ultraviolet light technology air-scrubber system has been installed in all buildings. (Kills 99% of bacteria, mold, spores, viruses, and VOCs/Volatile Organic Compounds in indoor air on campus.)

DOORS AND WINDOWS

Classroom doors and windows will be left open when weather permits to improve ventilation.

Facilities Modifications STEPS TO MINIMIZING SPREAD OF COVID-19



PHYSICAL DISTANCING SIGNAGE

Foot-traffic patterns will be clearly marked on campus, including oneway flow where required. In locations where students queue, markers designating 6-foot intervals have been placed on the ground.

ISOLATION ROOMS

Two isolation rooms for students who become sick while on-campus have been established.

CLASSROOM SEATING


Classroom seating has been reduced to facilitate physical distancing and soft surfaces have been removed to minimize materials that cannot be sanitized easily.

OUTDOOR LIBRARY

A mini-library will be established outside of the Learning Commons.

OUTDOOR DINING

Lunch and snack will be held outdoors whenever possible. When all divisions return, we may find it necessary to have "Rain Days," where students return to remote learning temporarily.



Facilities Cleaning Protocols STEPS TO MINIMIZING SPREAD OF COVID-19

CLEANING AND DISINFECTING PROCEDURES HAVE BEEN SIGNIFICANTLY EXPANDED:

- Two janitorial staff members will be present when students are on campus for frequent cleaning of restrooms and high-touch surfaces such as door handles, light switches, and handrails.
- All campus rooms will be cleaned nightly.
- Deeper cleaning of entire campus will occur twice each week.
- Playground equipment, which may only be used by one stable group at a time and will be disinfected between uses.
