REGULAR SEASON COMING TO AN END AFTER A SUCCESSFUL SPRING

The varsity track team competed in another meet at Asheville School on April 19, 2021. Grace D'Angelo '24 ran a personal best in the 200-meter dash, running 32.64. Katie Rudins '22 also ran a personal record in the same race, finishing in 31.34. Sara Grace Dalton '22, who ran in the girls' 1600m, ran a personal best of 6:15, while Lia Sprouse '21 competed in the same event and finished second. In the girls' 800-meter race, junior Erin Hovendon and eighthgrader Caroline Barton came in first and second, respectively. They both clocked personal bests at 2:24.30 (Hovendon) and 2:26.60 (Barton). The girls' 4x400m relay team also came in first in a tight race against the Asheville School team. Abigail Crowder finished 3rd in the 100-meter hurdles, her first time competing in the event, and 2nd and 4th in the high jump and long jump finals, respectively.

On the boy's side, Luke Shao '23 ran personal bests in both the 100-meter dash, running 12.54, and the 200-meter dash, clocking 25.94. Senior Graham Ryan made a huge leap in the 400-meter dash, coming in fourth and running a personal best of 55.44. Junior Nicholas Schussler finished fourth in the 300-meter hurdles, clocking a speedy 46.14 and snagging a personal record. The boys 4x400m relay team came in second and beat Christ School in a race down the homestretch. In the boys high jump finals, Patrick Thies '21 came in third and was 6th in the long jump; Senior Henry Broshar was 9th. Noah Mraz '22 came in 6th in both the discus and shot put finals. Asher McKinney-Ring came in fifth in the discus finals and scored a personal best as well.

Varsity boys tennis had an excellent showing recently with matches against the Asheville Trailblazers and Asheville Christian Academy. On April 12 against the Trailblazers, Aidan Darr '25 played his debut game and won both singles and doubles. On April 20 against ACA, co-captains William Sword and Nicholas Stanier led the way to victory. Middle school talents Nick D'Angelo and Akash Karvir also played to win while senior Jonathan Kadau cemented the 'W' against the tough Asheville Christian Academy team.

The game was a tough one, but the girls came alive in the last minutes to score two goals and narrowly lost against the Blues.
