- Discussion of meeting topics relative to SCC role in providing recommendations to SIC for planning
- SCC members posed questions about how families can negotiate their changing preferences with more information about the plan, seeking information about half-day schedule, other topics.
- Motion by Amy Fehlberg (seconded PP) that SCC make a recommendation to SIC to 1) directly poll teachers and staff about district scheduling options; supporting their preferences supports students; 2) based on conversations with families of varied modality preference, SCC would like to affirm the stance of the district that expanded classroom practices (also called hybrid) contribute to teacher burnout and should be discouraged; 3) SCC would like to support the school in creating a model for faculty, staff and family surveying throughout the trimester. Discussing this in January and February would help recommend meaningful (minor) modifications before the last trimester begins in March. (Motion passes unanimously).
