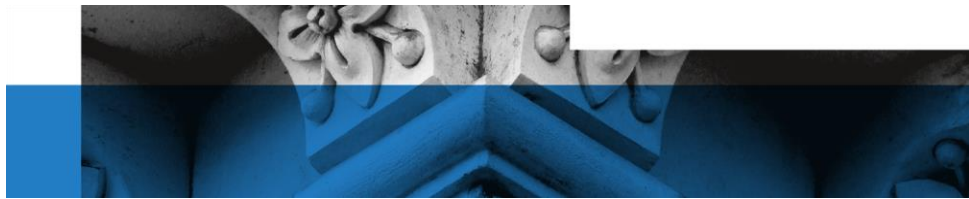

Helping Individual Boys

In addition to a full Careers Education and Information Provision, the Dulwich Careers and Higher Education team are available to see each student individually. Whether helping boys to work out their interests, or whether developing a known career aspiration, boys can be guided in their research skills. Some paths, such as degree apprenticeships or gap year schemes, require early planning and staff can support students through this process.

Connected

Dulwich benefits from maintaining links with external contacts comprising: former and current Dulwich parents, Old Alleynians and links built by Careers with organisations. These external contacts ensure we are up-to-date with the developments in their career areas and provide a wealth of advice and opportunities for boys. For example:

- Telephone advice to Careers staff or to boys
- Presentations at the College (e.g. to a relevant Society)
- Insight Visits at organisations to learn about specific professions, tours of premises, meetings with graduate trainees
- Attendance at the annual Courses and Careers Convention
- Provision of links and invitations to events for boys
- Guidance at our Career-specific Networking events, and also the opportunity for students to attend Alleyn Club networking events

Facilitating links for boys with external organisations also provides the perfect means for teaching networking skills and good practice in communicating with professionals outside the comfortable school environment.

FROM YEAR 11 to the UPPER SCHOOL and beyond ...

The formal Careers programme for Year 11 is built upon Morrisby Profile which provides a tailor-made, interactive careers profile that can continually be updated as students develop their planning for post-16 and 18 education and beyond. Students have life long online access to their profile, which can be edited and updated at any time. The Morrisby profiles are the basis for the Careers course taught in Wellbeing lessons in Year 11. Following the Michaelmas half term all students will have an interview with an independent Careers Adviser. The boys are expected to continue their research as part of our Professional Insight Programme.

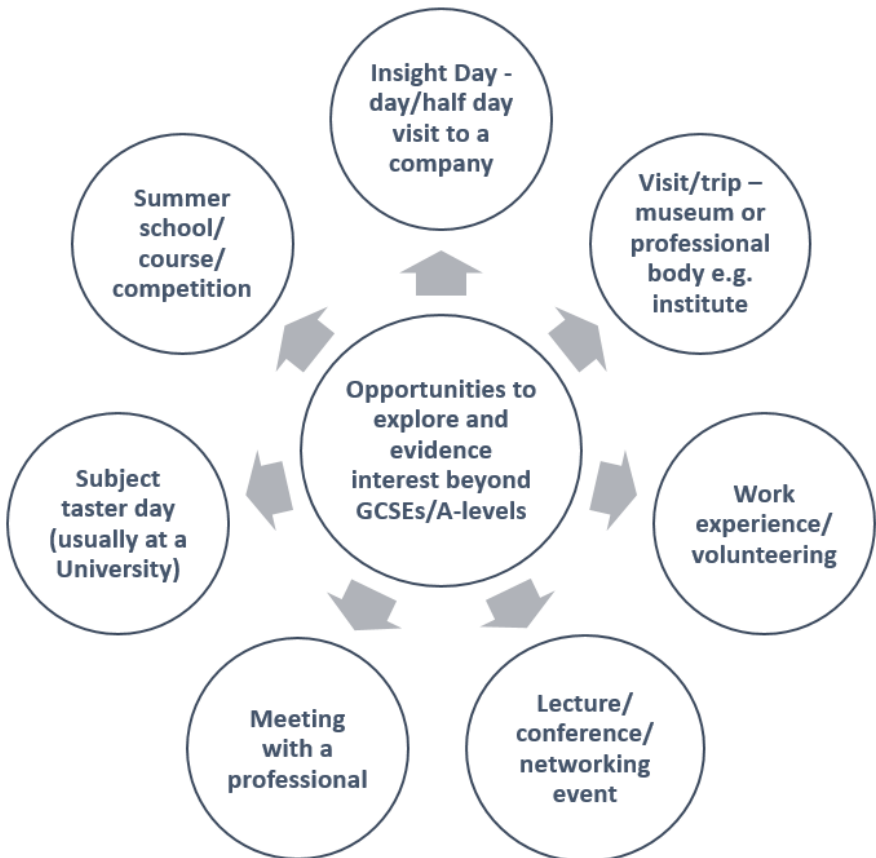
Boys and their parents attend the annual Courses and Careers Convention during the Lent term, and whilst Year 11 boys find it helpful as they consider A level subjects, Remove boys can take advice from the many university representatives, professionals and Institutes.

During the Remove, boys are invited to a one to one career meeting, begin researching post A level options and can attend relevant lunch time talks and careers events, including those organised by the Alleyn Club. All students are given access to Unifrog, an online resource to help with university research both in the UK and overseas. Boys are encouraged to visit Careers at any time to speak to staff if they need any assistance.

Interview training is provided in the Sixth Form with Oxbridge Interviews (OxFizz) and with Interview Guru.

The Professional Insight Programme

This has been created to assist boys in developing a greater understanding of a profession, career or academic subject. It can involve an insight visit to an organisation, meeting a professional, attending a lecture or conference, voluntary work, visiting a museum or professional institute, entering a competition or attending a summer school or university taster day.



Sector Networking Events

Networking events are organised where typically 20 professionals from a particular Career area or sector are invited to the College. Prior to these events boys are briefed on how to utilise the exchanges and are requested to study the professional biographies of the guests they are to meet and talk with informally over refreshments. Boys learn how to network and are encouraged to establish links and pursue opportunities. In the last 18 months, networking events have been held focusing on the Creative Industries, Humanities & Languages and STEM.

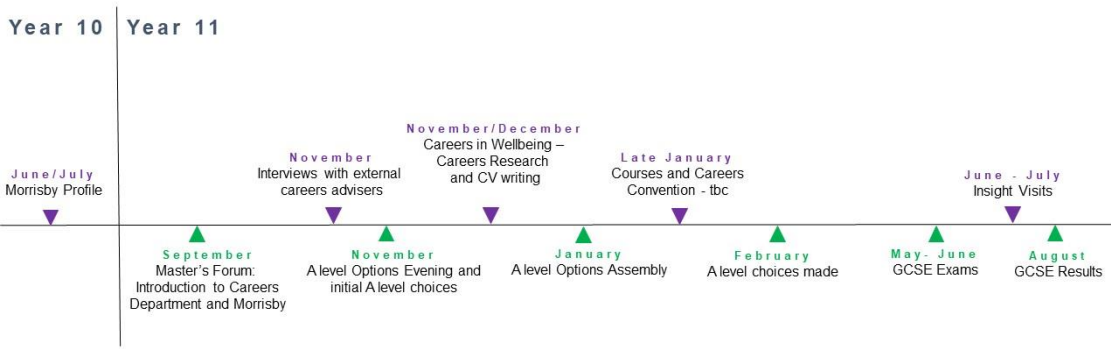

For life after Dulwich College we are able to assist boys in planning their gap year with suggestions for paid or voluntary work, or overseas travel.

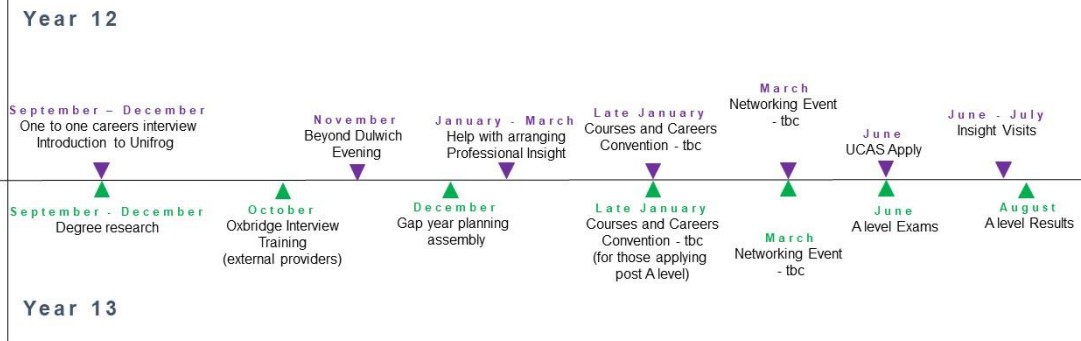

Upper School Timeline



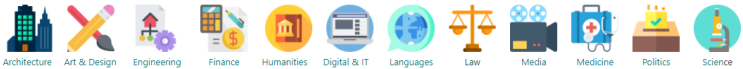
Throughout the year drop-in appointments for both year groups to help with careers and university research, arranging professional insight, CV and cover letter writing and gap year planning
