




BALANCED



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

Why be a Full DP Candidate? Why take some IB DP Courses?

- College Admissions offices: Students who have taken IB courses are looked upon favorably-- especially IB DP Candidates.
- College Credit across the globe not just Washington for a score of 4-7.
- Full DP Candidacy -- this is an ACHIEVEABLE CHALLENGE!
 - 3 Standard Level courses.
 - 3 Higher Level courses.
 - Core (Theory of Knowledge class, Extended Essay, Creativity-Activity-Service hours)
 - Need 24 "points" to earn the full IB Diploma.
 - Points are earned by scoring at certain levels on HL, SL, and Core components (a few colleges award more college credit for DP students who earn 30 or more points)

Researchers examined the **post-secondary outcomes of DP students in the US** through a large quantitative study. The DP student cohort included DP course students (students taking one or more DP exams), DP candidates (students pursuing the full DP), DP candidates who received the diploma, and all DP students (combined). Findings showed that 82.2% of all US DP students enrolled in college immediately after graduating from high school, compared to 66% of all US high school graduates (figure 1). Of the DP graduates who enrolled in college immediately after high school, 88% returned to the same institution the following year, compared to 80% of all US students (Pilchen, Caspary and Woodworth 2020).

Full Diploma Program: The Core

- Theory of Knowledge (TOK) can also be taken as an elective
 - Discussion-based class exploring how we know the things we think we know
- Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS)
 - Reflections on things you may already to doing (Art & Music, Sports, Volunteer/Community Service, etc.)
 - Opportunity to stretch yourself in these areas
- Extended Essay (EE)
 - Geek out on a topic you're curious about
 - Good practice for the kind of writing expected in college

IB versus Running Start


How to Decide:



- Running Start offers direct transfer college credit to In-State colleges and universities, it requires students to be off-campus (own transportation) and be self-advocates all while still being required to take exams and other activities at Foss High School.
 - Community college instructors do often not have teaching credentials.
- IB courses are accepted for direct college credit all over the U.S. and around the world, colleges have published credit equivalency for passing IB scores. For more information contact the college you are interested in attending for input on the courses they would prefer to see on your transcript (Foss counselors can help with this!).
 - Foss teachers have received special training to be IB teachers.
 - Teachers are able to provide specific support, care, and experience with high schoolers.
 - DP students and staff are a special community united for success.








WHY Full Career Program?

- CP students undertake a minimum of two IB Diploma Programme (DP) courses, a core consisting of four components and a careerrelated study.
- For CP students, DP courses provide the theoretical underpinning and academic rigour of the programme; the career-related study further supports the programme's academic strength and provides practical, real-world approaches to learning; and the CP core helps them to develop skills and competencies required for lifelong learning.
- At graduation, CP students earn an IB sash demonstrating completion of an IB program!





IB Research conducted a study to examine the **higher** education pathways of all CP graduates in the US from 2013 to 2015. The study found that 81% of CP graduates enrolled in university sometime after high school, with 76% enrolling immediately. Additionally, 79% of students who enrolled in higher education chose four-year over two-year colleges, compared to 64% of students nationally. Regarding university persistence, 89% of CP graduates who enrolled in university returned for their second year (Mack, Halic and Burd 2017).

- follow their chosen education and career pathways in life
- combine academic subjects with their personal and professional interests and skills
- engage in learning that makes a positive difference to their community
- think critically and creatively
- communicate clearly and effectively in a variety of situations
- work independently and in collaboration with others
- consider new perspectives and other points of view
- develop greater self-confidence and self-awareness
- demonstrate high levels of resilience and flexibility
- be internationally-minded and globally aware
- apply their knowledge to real-world scenarios and situations.
