### **IRISH HAVE STRONG SHOWING AT HIGHEST HONORS INVITE**

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Golf team had its best performance of the year to date, finishing with a team score of 331 at the Highest Honors Invite held at Huron Meadows Golf Course. The score led the Irish to a 12th place finish in a very competitive 19 team field. Brock English led the way for Notre Dame with a 69, taking second to individual champion Scott Hanna from Country Day who holed out from the fairway on his final hole. Joey Maniaci finished with an 81 for the Irish, Emilio Ruma had a strong effort with a 90, and Jack Anderson rounded out the scoring with a 91.

### **IRISH HEAD TO MUSKRAT CLASSIC**

Last Saturday, the Notre Dame Track and Field teams were in Algonac for the Muskrat Classic Invitational, a mostly relay events schedule with some unique twists. The boys team had entries in numerous events, including in the "Rat Relay" with legs of 100m, 200m, 300m, and 600M. The team of freshman Lucas Mylenek, freshman Rajah Alexander-Nevels, senior Caleb Webb, and senior Eli Seitzinger finished runner-up and the team of junior James Kautz, junior Chris Galle, junior Josh Reid, and Alexander-Nevels had the same result in the 4x200. In the 4x100, junior Billy Newman, Webb, Mylenek, and senior Clayton Bone crossed the line in second place. Bone competed in the 100m dash, too, reached the finals, and placed second. Newman was second in the long jump. The girls were led by freshman Zoe Hoke, winner of the 1600m run. Senior Mya Fromwiller placed fourth in the high jump. Hoke and Fromwiller were then joined by senior Lexi Fraser and junior Kate Stacey to finish third in the 4x400. In the 4x800, Hoke, Fraser, Stacey, and senior Madison Monaghan were second. In the famed "Rat Relay", the team of freshman Kasey Creek, senior Joanna Riss, junior Emily Mourad, and Monaghan placed second.

### **NOTRE DAME TAKES 13TH AT FARMINGTON INVITE**

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Golf team shot a team score of 353 on a chilly, windy day at the Farmington Invite to finish 13th out of a strong 24 team field. ### IRISH POST IMPRESSIVE TIMES AT DCDS MEET

The Notre Dame Boys and Girls Track and Field teams faced Detroit Country Day last week in a dual meet. Although, both the boys and girls team fell short in the overall score, there were some great times and performances posted in many events. For the girls, senior Mya Fromwiller placed second in the 200m dash and third in the 100m dash with times of 28.61 and 15.12, respectively. In relay events, freshman Zoe Hoke, senior Madison Monaghan, junior Kate Stacey, and senior Lexi Fraser carried the baton in the 4x800 and finished first in 10:56.72. Stacey, Fraser, Fromwiller, and senior Tessa Censoni won the 4x400 in 4:31.66. Stacey also recorded 65.97 in the 400m dash, which was good for third place. In distance events, Fraser was first in the 3200m run and Hoke and Monaghan were first and third in the 1600m run. Junior Kaity Heaman placed third in both the 100m and 300m hurdle events with times of 23.01 and 60.00, both personal records (PR). Finally, in field events, senior Joanna Riss placed 2nd in the shot put with a throw of 19'11", a PR, and senior Alyson Tiller was third with a toss of 19'9". Junior Emily Mourad was third in the long jump. On the boys side, senior Clayton Bone led the way with a first place in the 200m dash and second place finishes in both the 100m dash and long jump. Bone's 23.96 in the 200 and 11.3 in the 100 are both PRs. Senior Eli Seitzinger also had first and second place finishes, winning the 800m run in 2:20.89 and finishing second in the 1600m run in 5:10.47. Senior Ben Pocius had a pair of second place finishes in hurdle events. Pocius recorded PRs in the 110m hurdles, 16.15, and 300m hurdles, 44.06. In relays, junior Billy Newman, senior Caleb Webb, freshman Lucas Mylenek,

and Bone crossed the line in 46.04 to place second in the 4x100 and junior Josh Reid, junior James Kautz, junior Tyler Wojichowski, and Seitzinger won the 4x400 in 3:50.43. In field events, junior Alex Scherle threw the shot 35'4" to place second and Newman won the long jump with a leap of 18'2.5". Newman also recorded a PR in the 200m dash with a time of 24.34

### NOTRE DAME SWEEPS DH OVER HOLLY

The Notre Dame Varsity Softball team took both ends of a doubleheader over Holly. In the opener, Ryann Simmonds picked up the win on the mound, giving up five runs (two earned) while striking out six in an 11-5 victory. Jordan Smith led the offense with three hits, scored once and drove in one. Regina Roose had two hits, including a double scored twice and drove in one and Elena Schwegman had two hits scored one and drove in one. In the nightcap Notre Dame collected 15 hits on their way to a 13-3 win. Ani Wachowiak picked up the win, yielding three unearned runs on two hits to go with five strikeouts. Schwegman collected three doubles and scored three times while Smith had another strong day at the plate with three hits, three runs scored, and three RBI. Amanda Roth and Simmonds each added two hits as well for the Irish.
