Dear Parents and Guardians,

The Fenton Charter Public Schools (FCPS) are currently enrolling for the 2021-2022 school year. You may begin the enrollment process for any child not currently attending a Fenton school by calling the school of interest or by visiting our website http://www.fentoncharter.net/ and selecting "Enroll Now". Click on this video to learn about the enrollment process at one of our schools, Fenton Primary Center.

Fenton Summer Learning Activities: We are making plans to provide our students with extended learning opportunities over the summer. We want to offer interested students the opportunity to participate in a summer program at our schools daily from 8am - 12pm. We are exploring the option to have students on a two (2) week block of time at school. Depending on space and interest, students may be able to attend multiple 2 week sessions. Contact your child's school for more information.

After School Programs: The Fenton schools are seeking input from our families on their interest for after school programs. Fenton is currently piloting after school programs for students from 12pm to 4pm on a daily basis. We are working with Think Together and LA's Best to serve as many students as possible that are interested in remaining on campus until 4pm. Contact your child's school if you are interested in after school programs for your child.

2021-2022 Fenton Instructional Calendar: The calendar for the 2021-2022 school is scheduled for approval at the FCPS Board of Directors on May 20, 2021. Pending board approval, Fenton will extend the number of instructional days for students by six days for a total of 190 days. This is ten (10) days more than the typical elementary school in the greater Los Angeles area. Here are a few highlights of the calendar.

First Day of School 8/10/21 Spring Break 4/11 - 4/15/22

Thanksgiving Break 11/22 – 11/26/21 Last Day of School 6/10/22

Winter Break 12/20 - 1/5/22

Instructional Model for Next Year: LA County is currently in the Yellow Tier with an Adjusted Case Rate of 0.7%. We continue to follow the <u>Reopening Protocols for K-12 Schools</u> by the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health. We do not know what conditions will look like in the Fall. We are making plans to accommodate students for in-person instruction on a traditional schedule with small class sizes, masking, and social distancing. Fenton plans to offer students an Independent Study option for families that choose to remain on a distance learning only model. We will continue to keep you informed as we receive more details from local and state public health officials.
