### LIBRARY NEWS

The HOLD Cart & Return Cart are available from Wed-Fridays just inside the front door! All students can now access Destiny Library on their Blue navigation bar to the left inside their Library Course on student's Dashboard inside Canvas and place a HOLD on books in our Library!!! Library Lessons: For K-6th grade, Library lessons are a part of the Utah Core Curriculum covering Reading Engagement, Digital Citizenship/Media Literacy, & Information & Research. Lessons for students should appear in Canvas on their Dashboard. Fifth grade LIB lessons are available from Sunday to the following Monday. For K-2, LIB lessons are available from Monday to the following Monday. For 3rd, 4th, & 6th graders, LIB lessons are available from Tuesday to the following Tuesday. All lessons have extended due dates.

Grades: For the first time ever, the Library Tech Teacher (Mrs. Park) is giving the Information Technology grade in our District at the Elementary level. For this first term, in an effort to be kind in this COVID season, the District has created a third category designated as DA (Didn't Attend). Students who did minimal to zero work with Library lessons this term, will receive the DA grade under Information Technology and all other students will receive an "S" grade. (In my mind, the S, this time, stands for Sufficient for this time period).

The grading rubric for Library Lessons/Information Technology Grade the second trimester will be: 0-10% DA 10%-60% = N = Needs Improvement 60-100% = S = as in Satisfactory
