What a great week we had last week! We seemed to have very few problems with the shuffle of students to new teachers and/or new modes of learning. Our online teachers have worked hard to make the transition for new students as easy as possible for them, as are the teachers for those students in this week's transitions. Our procedures here at school seem to be working well also. We will continue to monitor, and we will adjust as needed.

We know this has been a big change for parents as well, especially those bringing students back to the building. We appreciate your support and following our guidelines, such as where to have students line up for school and parking in the church parking lot across the street if walking your students to their lines. This helps tremendously with congestion in our two parking lots and greatly decreases the chance for an accident.
