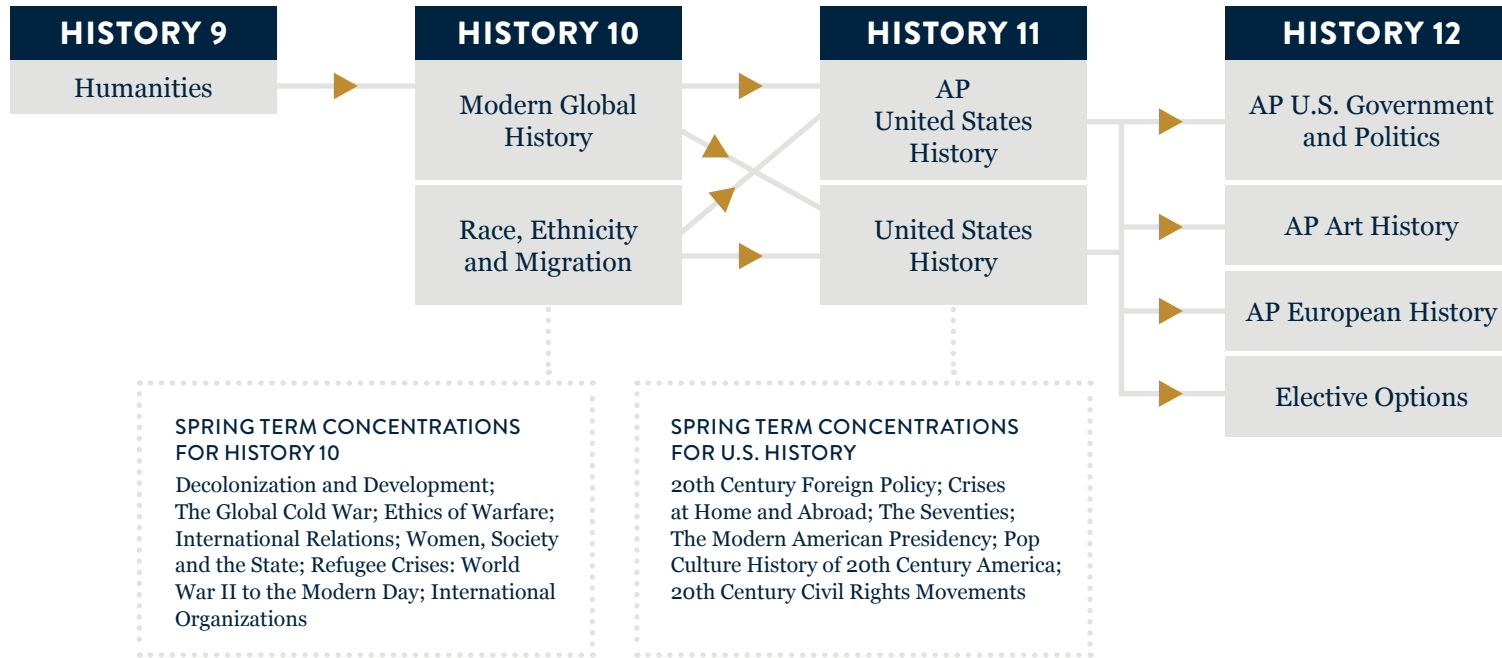

NOTES

- 9th, 10th, 11th grade courses are full-year (three trimesters).
- New 10th graders who have already taken Modern Global History are enrolled in the Race, Ethnicity and Migration class, which is a skills-based course designed to integrate new students into the history classroom.
- All 10th graders choose a thematic focus for the spring term which centers on a global post-World War II theme. They will also complete a major research paper this term.
- 11th graders enrolled in U.S. History choose a 20th century thematic focus for the spring term.
- Students who qualify may take AP U.S. History as juniors and other AP courses as seniors.
- Spring term focus courses and electives vary annually.
- The Department offers a Signature Program in Asian Studies.
