2021 Middle School Summer School Program

**MIDDLE SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM**

The middle school summer school program is designed to meet the needs of students who were unsuccessful in one or more core courses (English/Language Arts, Math, Science, or Social Studies) during the 2020-2021 school year or who have been invited by the school to attend. Middle school students who do not pass one or more core classes are required to attend summer school to be promoted to the next grade. This is an integrated experience that focuses on skills needed to access requisite curriculum in the next grade.

Public school students enrolled in grades 6, 7, and 8 during the 2020-2021 school year may attend CCPS summer school. Students at Northern Middle and Windy Hill Middle will attend summer school at Windy Hill Middle School. Students at Plum Point Middle and Calvert Middle will attend summer school at Calvert Middle School. Students at Mill Creek Middle and Southern Middle will attend summer school at Mill Creek Middle School.

**SUMMER SCHOOL SCHEDULE**

Middle school summer classes will begin on **Monday, June 14, and conclude on Thursday, July 1**. The session will be 8AM-12PM. Students will be engaged in integrated math and science and English and social studies experiences. These experiences will build skills required in curriculum in the next grades. This year, there is no fee to attend the summer school program.

**REGISTRATION PROCEDURES**

Printed copies can be obtained from the student's middle school. **Registration for summer school begins on May 11, 2021.** Approval from the principal and a school counselor are required before registration may be completed.

Printed summer school registration forms should be submitted to the school counselor. Once approved, the counselor will forward registration forms to the the lead teacher at each of the regional sites.

Final class schedules are determined from the registration data. Students will be notified by the summer school office of their enrollment and the class schedule for summer school by June 10, 2021.

**ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS**

Since summer school lasts for only 12 days, it is very important that participating students maintain excellent attendance. **Credit will be denied if a student misses more than one day of summer school.** Students are not excused from class for dental appointments, camp, sports or vacations. Students who cannot attend all classes should not enroll in courses for credit. Students are also required to be on time for every class. Those who arrive late or leave early may not earn course credit.

**TUITION**

\*A non-resident is a person who is permanently located outside Calvert County during the regular academic year.

If applicable, full tuition must be paid by June 11, 2021. Checks are to be made payable to Calvert County Public Schools. If a student withdraws from a course after attending one or more classes, **no tuition will be refunded.**

## **TRANSPORTATION**

Calvert County Public Schools **may** provide transportation during the summer term.
