# CALVERT COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS 2025 Middle School Summer School Program

The middle school summer school program is designed to meet the needs of students who were unsuccessful in one or more core courses (English/Language Arts, Math, Science, or Social Studies) during the 2024-2025 school year or who have been invited by their school to attend. Middle school students who do not pass one or more core classes are required to attend summer school to be promoted to the next grade. This integrated experience focuses on skills needed to access the requisite curriculum in the next grade level.

CCPS students enrolled in grades 6, 7, and 8 during the 2024-2025 school year may attend summer school.

- Students at Northern Middle, Plum Point Middle, and Windy Hill Middle will attend summer school at Plum Point Middle School.
- Students at Calvert Middle, Mill Creek Middle, and Southern Middle will attend summer school at Mill Creek Middle School.

## SUMMER SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Middle school summer classes will begin on **Monday, July 7, and conclude on Thursday, July 24**. The session will be from 8:30 AM – 12:15 PM and will run Monday through Thursday. Students will be engaged in math, science, and an integrated English and social studies experience. There is no fee for CCPS students to attend summer school. Private school students and non-county residents may attend middle school summer school for a fee of \$250.00 payable at the summer school location being attended.

#### **REGISTRATION PROCEDURES**

Online registration forms can be found for Middle Summer School by visiting <u>MS Summer School Registration Form</u>. **Registration for summer school begins on May 19, 2025. The registration link above will not be available until May 19. Registration closes at 11:59 p.m. on June 25, 2025.** Approval from the principal and a school counselor is required before registration may be completed.

Printed summer school registration forms should be submitted to the school counselor. Once approved, the counselor will forward registration forms to the lead teacher at each regional site.

Final schedules are determined from the registration data. The summer school office will notify students of their enrollment for summer school by June 30, 2025.

#### ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

Since summer school lasts for only 12 days, it is very important that participating students maintain excellent attendance. **Credit will be denied if a student misses more than one day of summer school.** Students are not excused from class for dental appointments, camp, sports, or vacations. Students who cannot attend all classes should not enroll. Students are also required to be on time for every class. If applicable, those who arrive late or leave early may not be promoted.

## TUITION

Private School/Non-County Resident	\$250.00

\*A non-resident is a person who is permanently located outside Calvert County during the regular academic year.

If applicable, full tuition must be paid by June 26, 2025. Checks are to be made payable to Calvert County Public Schools. No tuition will be refunded if a student withdraws from summer school after attending one or more sessions.
