The 2021 Bond for Tulsa Public Schools includes exciting additions to the Webster campus! The proposed package includes will enhance the Webster student experience by:



Replacing the athletic turf, waterproofing the stadium, and installing a new field house sound system.

- » Creating a new band/orchestra addition, providing designated space for students to participate in music programs;
- » Expanding and modernizing the school's agricultural education program with a state-of-the-art aquaponic and hydroponic greenhouse facility;
- » Remodeling for the school's science labs and investing in STEM equipment;
- » Refreshing the auditorium with upgraded lighting and sound systems, repainting, and installing new stage curtains;
- » Funding ADA-accessibility improvements in school restrooms and at building exits;
- » Remodeling for the school's science labs and investing in STEM equipment; and
- » Parking lot resurfacing and improvements to exterior lighting.



## TOTAL INVESTMENT IN WEBSTER MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL: \$14 MILLION

### PROPOSITION 2: STUDENT AND CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY - \$2 MILLION

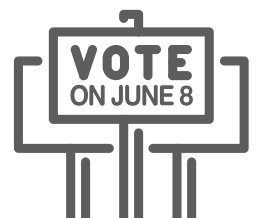
- » Network and systems upgrades

- » Wellness and physical education



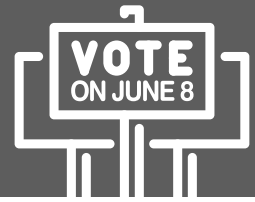
