My husband, Tony, and I are delighted to join The Winifred West Legacy. My family connection with Frensham goes back four generations: my two aunts in the days of Miss West; my sister Pru and I in the '50s; our two girls in the '70s; and our two granddaughters.

Frensham has changed—through ambitious building projects; and academically, where Frensham has made giant strides.

While results are paramount, extracurricular activities such as Sport, Art and Music add balance. Frensham singing still sends goose bumps up my spine, and those magnificent plays are fantastic.

But Frensham is more than that. It's the 'X' factor, the 'I don't know what', the 'je ne sais quoi'—the amazing 'something' that is born in its beautiful bush setting, in Clubbe Hall, Sturt and the Holt: 'In Love Serve One Another', builds enduring friendships, commitment, and character that last a lifetime.

I see the Legacy as a good opportunity for us to give back to the School that has given us so much.

Many students have been helped by Diana Jenkins (1934)

Her bequest in 2010 was inspired by her personal story as the recipient of support to attend Frensham

iana Jenkins was a much-loved Old Girl, Fellowship Committee representative, Company Member and Frensham teacher. She lived her life by the philosophy that we must make a positive difference to the community we serve, and we must have a strong commitment to equity and inclusion.

Coming to Frensham in the 1930s Diana was determined that her life would be lived as instructed by Winifred West, a lifelong role model, to 'In Love Serve One Another'.

After school she moved to the UK. When global hostilities erupted, Diana wanted to fight for freedom, and so volunteered to monitor European broadcasts during WWII. It was exhausting and exacting, but Diana loved the contribution she was making.

It was Diana's Frensham education that gave her the strength and underpinning to take on these tasks during times of great stress and despair—and succeed.

Following the war, Diana broke new ground in the world of commerce, training staff in the use of textiles, such as the revolutionary new

- product—nylon! She is almost certainly one of the first Frensham girls to have gone into business on the managerial side.
- In 1961 Diana became Headmistress of the Middle School. Her wider view of the world after the War experience provided an extraordinary education for Frensham girls at that time. Diana was also the driving force behind the fundraising for Clubbe Hall.
- Moving back to the UK she became Secretary of London Fellowship and remained involved with Fellowship there for nearly 50 years.
- Diana used whatever resources she had, to help improve the world. She was exceptionally good at getting herself and others involved in issues that mattered, and doing things that hadn't been done before.
- After her death, Diana made a bequest to support the enrolment of children who could not afford to stay at Frensham.
- When women thrive, their families and communities thrive, and that is reflected in stronger societies. Diana's Frensham friendships, and the heart to give, have turned into something incredible.

Diana Jenkins' legacy? A true philanthropic partnership is having a life-changing impact on those who benefit from it. What will be your legacy?

TYPES OF BEQUESTS

Different ways you can remember Frensham Schools in your Will, include:

A percentage of your estate

This ensures that, even if your assets increase or decrease in value, the bequest you wish to leave will adjust accordingly.

The residue of your estate

It is important that your wording clearly expresses your wishes and we suggest if you are creating or updating your Will, you consult with your legal advisor. 'I give to Winifred West Schools Foundation Ltd ABN 53 001 862 102 for its general purposes, [insert as applicable]

The whole of my estate OR

The residue of my estate.

AND I declare that the written acknowledgement of the Secretary or other proper officer of Winifred West Schools Foundation shall be accepted by my trustee as a full and complete discharge and that my trustee shall not be bound to see application thereof.'
