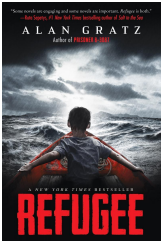

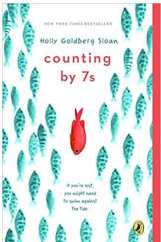

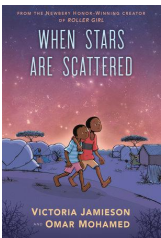

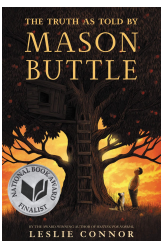


When Stars are Scattered* by Victoria Jamieson and Omar Mohamed
