# **Math Decision Rules**

#### **Decision Rules:**

#### Screening:

- ☑ Kindergarten: Students receiving a 1\* on the progress report are considered for Tier II support.
- ☑ 1st grade students: Students receiving a 1\* on the progress report are considered for Tier II Support.
- ☑ 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade: Students receiving a 1\* on the progress report OR scoring below 20<sup>th</sup> percentile based on STAR Math are considered for Tier II support
- For all grades, progress report information takes into account all areas scored in math. If there is a 1\* in any category, a student may be considered for intervention. Further screening may be appropriate using the EnVision Math diagnostic assessment. Consider using the grade level below to identify skill deficit areas.

### **Progress Monitoring:**

STAR Math progress monitoring is conducted at least once a month. Trend lines are reviewed every 12 weeks. In-program assessment data should be collected as well.

# Intensifying Instruction:

- ☑ If progress is below the expected rate after 12 weeks, collect individualizing information and move to Tier III level support.
- ☑ If progress is below the expected after 6 weeks of Tier III intervention, RTII team considers a referral to special education.

<sup>\*</sup>In some cases a 2 on the progress report may support intervention time. This is one piece of evidence used in a team decision, other classroom data should support the need for intervention as well as the progress report score.
