IRISH TAKE SECOND AT OAKLAND COUNTY INVITE

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Golf team shot its best round of the season, firing a 307 to place second at the Oakland County Division II Championship held at Crystal Lake. Brock English finished with a 70 to tie for second individually and Joey Maniaci was right behind with a 71 to place fifth. Both English and Maniaci both qualified individually for the Oakland County Division I tournament. Jack Anderson had his best round of the year with an 81 and Emilio Ruma had an impressive score of 85 to round out the scoring effort.

Last Saturday, the Notre Dame Boys and Girls Track and Field teams participated in the 10th Mark Carpenter Invite at Dearborn Divine Child High School. Senior Eli Seitzinger led the boys with second place finish in the 800m run with a massive personal record (PR), 2:04.38. Senior Clayton Bone was seventh in the 100m dash while also competing in the long jump. Junior Billy Newman placed sixth in the long jump at 18'6.5". Setting new PRs were freshman Lucas Mylenek and junior Jack Kautz (200m dash), freshman Raja Alexander-Nevels (400m dash), and junior Tyler Wojichowski (800m run). 






IRISH COMPETE AT LANSING QUAD

In a non-scored quad meet at Waverly High School, numerous Notre Dame Boys and Girls Track and Field athletes hit personal and season best marks. The teams competed against Waverly High School, Lansing Eastern High School, and Haslett High School. The girls were once again led by senior Mya Fromwiller who placed fourth in the 100m dash, second in the 200m. dash, and second in the 400m dash. Fromwiller hit personal records (PR) in the 100m and 400m events with times of 13.92 and 1:04.92. Freshman Zoe Hoke had a fantastic meet, too, recording PRs in both the 400m and 800m distances. Hoke won the 800m run and was third in the 400m dash. Other strong performances were turned in by senior Joanna Riss, who threw the shot 23'3" to set a PR and senior Alyson Tiller, who recorded a season's best 60'4" throw in the discus. Other PRs came from freshman Kasey Creek (100m dash) and freshman Audrey Kuyoth (100m and 200m dashes). On the boy's side, freshman Raja Alexander-Nevels had a breakout performance, establishing new PRs in the 100m and 200m dashes. 11.99 and 24.59. Senior Eli Seitzinger and freshman Zach Mylenek finished 1-2 in the 400m dash in 55.33 and 56.57, respectively, with Seitzinger establishing a new PR. Freshman Wade Robinson made his high school debut in the 800m and 1600m runs, finishing in 2:25.33 and 5:12.54. PR's were also recorded by sophomore Becker Robinson (100m dash and 200m dashes), junior Kevin Noe (100m and 200m dashes), freshman Luke Burtraw (200m dash), freshman Troy Kilanowski (800m and 1600m runs), freshman Gavin DeYoung (800m and 1600m runs), freshman Boyd Robinson (shot put), and freshman Paul Williams (shot put).

NOTRE DAME TAKES DH OVER AVONDALE

The Notre Dame Varsity Softball team improved to 17-6 on the season with a doubleheader sweep of Avondale. In the opening game, Ryann Simmonds picked up the win on the mound, combining with Jordan Smith to limit the Yellow Jackets to two runs (one earned) with five strikeouts in the 14-2 victory. Smith led the offensive attack with a four-hit performance, scoring twice and driving four, including a home run off the roof in left center field.
