Uniform Reminder

At PHIA we believe a uniform enables pupils to feel a sense of belonging, to feel secure in their environment and encourages a sense of pride in their appearance. Now we are fully re-opened after lock-down, and shops are now opened, we request all pupils to be in full uniform at all times, unless under exceptional circumstances.

All uniform and PE kit must be clearly named, with the child's first name and surname.

Academy uniform: maroon sweatshirt / cardigan, white polo shirt, grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress (not black) and dark grey, black or white socks or dark grey, black or maroon tights . Shoes or trainers should be plain black with no logo. Summer uniform might also include pink and white checked gingham dresses.

PE kit should include: a white T-shirt, maroon shorts and black plimsolls. Dark jogging bottoms/ sweatshirts (<u>without</u> <u>logos)</u> are required for outdoor sessions.
