#### CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON FOR OUR WILDCAT ATHLETES

The varsity track team competed in the conference meet at Asheville School on Wednesday, May 5, 2021. The Carolina Day team won the girls 4x800m relay race, while individual runners and jumpers also had strong showings. Senior Lia Sprouse won the 3200 with a time of 12:12 and Katie Rudins '22 came in second with a time of 12:29. Erin Hovendon '22 placed first in the girls 800m run, finishing in a speedy 2:24. Caroline Barton '25 crossed the line three seconds later to secure second place in 2:27. 8th grader Caroline Barton was also the conference champion in the girls 1600m. Abigail Crowder '21 was second in both the long jump and the high jump, getting PRs in both events.

On the boys side of things, the 4x400 relay team was second in the conference behind Asheville School. Nick Schussler '22 was fourth in 300m hurdles with a time of 45.25. Graham Ryan '21 was fourth in the 400m dash, crossing the line at 55.67. Girls varsity and JV soccer competed recently as well. The JV team played at Mount Pisgah Academy on April 28 to finish out the season. An early goal got the Wildcats out in front and the excitement was felt all over the field. The team played hard and never let up; a theme of their season. The coaches were so pleased and proud of the girls this year as they showed up every game ready to give their best performance. The varsity baseball team capped off a strong season with a 15-0 shutout against Bethel Christian Academy. The Wildcats offense was led by Henry Tutera going 3 for 3 with 3 runs batted in. Seniors Nate Roberson and Bennett Slosman both went 1 for 3 with Roberson driving in 1 run and Slosman picking up 2 rbi. Carolina Day also got runs batted in from Martiste Mills, Levi Ellison, Seth Caldwell, Finn McCartney, Lily Everette, and Roan Dunn. On the mound, Seth Caldwell '21 closed out his career with a dominant performance finishing the complete game shutout. Caldwell struck out a career-high 13 batters in the game. In the spring season, the Wildcat Baseball Club was led by senior Bennett Slosman hitting .476, fellow senior Nate Roberson hitting .447, and 6th grader Henry Tutera hitting .406. Senior Seth Caldwell led the Wildcats in runs batted in, driving in 13 on the season. 8th grader Martisite Mills led the Wildcats having a perfect season on the basepaths going 12 for 12 in stolen bases. Seth Caldwell picked up 2 of the wins for the Wildcats on the mound while Nate Roberson picked up the other 2 wins. Caldwell led the team in strikeouts, racking up 40 over 27 innings pitched. Roberson struck out 27 batters over 16 innings pitched. The pitching staff also picked up quality innings from 9th-grade contributors Lily Everette and Garen Hardin.
