



ACES FOUNDATION FUND: (April 1) for graduating seniors with a GPA of 2.5 or higher, planning on attending a school of higher education, and whose study shall be of business focus (management, administration, finance, actuarial sciences, etc.); also includes students studying trades such as cosmetology or HVAC with the intent to own their own business (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

AMES CHARITABLE FOUNDATION: (March 15) for graduating seniors with a minimum 3.0 GPA, who are dependent children of associates of Ames Inc., and plan to attend a post-secondary educational institution (Number of recipients varies/Up to \$4,000 per year for up to four years)

G. THOMAS BALSBAUGH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: (March 15) for graduating seniors of high schools in Dauphin County, planning to attend a four year college or university (One recipient/Up to \$1,000)

LINDA T. BUTLER SCHOLARSHIP: (March 31) for graduating seniors of Susquehanna Township High School that has not received any other monetary scholarships or awards (One recipient/Up to \$500)

CENTRAL PA ARCHITECTS FOUNDATION FUND ARCHITECTURE SCHOLARSHIP: (June 30) for students who are present or former residents of one of the following PA counties: Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, or York and are currently enrolled in an architecture degree program

HARRY N. AND MELVA A. DERICKSON SCHOLARSHIP: (March 15) for students who are residents of Dauphin, Cumberland, and Perry Counties, for study in preparation for medical or dental school, nursing, physical therapy, other medical related fields, or engineering (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

LOU DRANE FUND / JOSEPH L. AND VIVIAN E. STEELE FUND: (March 1) for students from studying classical music composition, teaching, and performance (Multiple recipients/Up to \$5,000)

EASH-POTTER SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (April 1) the scholarship will support students committed to improving the campus and community climate for LGBTQ people (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

ELY-WAIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (April 1) for graduating seniors from a high school in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, or Perry Counties with plans to pursue a field of study leading to a "green career" including to Environmental Science and Sustainable Technology (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

HOMEBUILDERS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (March 15) for students who have graduated from a high school in Dauphin, Cumberland, or Perry Counties with plans to attend an institution of higher learning or trade school. Preference is given to students in the building industry or related fields (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

HOMEBUILDERS ASSOCIATION SALES & MARKETING COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (April 1) for students who have graduated from a high school in Dauphin, Cumberland, or Perry Counties and plan to attend college or trade school furthering their education in the Building Industry or related field (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

ROBERTA L. HOUP T SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (April 1) for students from Dauphin, Cumberland and Perry Counties, studying nursing (Multiple recipients/Up to \$2,000)

LEADER SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (April 1) for graduating seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, Lancaster, or York Counties with plans to attend HACC Harrisburg's Campus as a full-time student to study in the LPN Program (Number of recipients varies/ Amount varies)

LEON I. LOCK AND BARBARA R. LOCK SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (April 1) for graduating seniors and graduates within the last five years of any high school in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, or Perry Counties, who will attend HACC to study nursing (Multiple recipients/Up to \$500)

LEON LOWENGARD SCHOLARSHIP: (June 15) for students attending Harrisburg City Public Schools and surrounding districts with a minimum GPA of 2.5; must be an undergraduate student. Preference will be given to students who are of Jewish faith (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

BRUCE MANGIONE FUND: (April 1) for students who attend school within the city of Harrisburg and children of the employees of NRG Energy (Harrisburg office) or Harrisburg Hilton and Towers (Two recipients/Up to \$1,500)

MCINROY-SHEFFER PEOPLE TRUST FUND: (April 1) for graduating seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, Lycoming, Tioga or York Counties, attending Mansfield University, York College, Central Penn College, Pennsylvania College of Technology, HACC or Harrisburg University studying elementary education, culinary arts, communications, fundamental business operations, hands-on trades, nursing, management, or e-business (Multiple recipients/Up to \$2,000)

ZACHARY MOORE MUSIC MEMORIAL FUND: (April 1) for graduating seniors from Susquehanna Township High School, Harrisburg High School, Sci-Tech High School, Capital Area School for the Arts (CASA), Steelton-Highspire High School, Central Dauphin High School, or Central Dauphin East High School with plans to attend a two-year, four-year, or trade school to study music (Number of recipients varies/Up to \$1,000)

PARTS SCHOLARSHIP PENNSYLVANIA AUTOMOTIVE RECYCLING TRADE SOCIETY: (April 1) for a child or step child of an owner who is an eligible active PARTS member or an employee who has worked for an eligible PARTS member for at least one year prior to March 15 or a child or step child of such an employee (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

PENNHOSA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (March 30) for affiliated, paid HOSA chapter members by January 1 with financial need (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

PENNSYLVANIA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SCHOLARSHIP: (March 1) for graduating seniors and legal residents of PA, with a minimum 3.0 GPA, planning to attend any four year college in PA, and demonstrating leadership and community service (Two recipients/Amount varies)

GARY D. RADINE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM: (March 15) for dependent children of a Delta Dental employee attending a two- or four-year accredited college as a full-time student with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and participating in extracurricular activities, work experience, and community service (Two recipients/\$5,000)

RICE FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND OF EICHELBERGERS, INC: (April 1) for graduating seniors who are dependent children of employees of Eichelbergers, Inc. (employed for at least one year), with a minimum 2.5 GPA, planning to attend any two or four year college in PA (Multiple recipients/Up to \$2,000 each per year for up to four years)

MARY SACHS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: (April 1) for graduating female high school seniors in Cumberland, Dauphin, Perry, or Lancaster Counties with plans to study fashion, fashion design, retailing, entrepreneurship, or business (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

RAY S. SHOEMAKER SCHOLARSHIP: (June 15) for students attending Harrisburg City Public Schools and surrounding districts with a minimum GPA of 2.5; must be an undergraduate student (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

THE ELAINE AND ROBERT SIEGEL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (March 15) for college-bound students from Harrisburg including graduating seniors and recent graduates of Harrisburg High School, SciTech High School, Dauphin County Technical School, Susquehanna Township School District, Central Dauphin High School, and Central Dauphin East High School (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

ANIL AND NEEMA THAKRAR FAMILY FUND #1: (March 15) for students from Cumberland, Dauphin, and Perry Counties with a GPA between 2.0-3.0 with plans to study math, science, or engineering (One recipient/Amount varies)

ANIL AND NEEMA THAKRAR FAMILY FUND #2: (March 15) for graduating seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, and Perry Counties, with GPA between 2.0-3.0, studying a medical related discipline (One recipient/Amount varies)

DR. FRANCIS J. VIOZZI MEMORIAL EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES: (April 1) for graduating seniors from any Dauphin or Lebanon County high school with plans to attend a four-year institution of higher education. The student must have a concentration in science related to environmental conservation (biology, wildlife management, environmental studies, engineering, etc.) (One recipient/Up to \$1,500)

JACK AND EDNA MAY YOST SCHOLARSHIP FUND: (March 15) for graduating seniors from Dauphin or Cumberland County high schools, with a minimum 2.5 GPA, attending any two or four year college or university; preference will be given to children of postal employees and students who plan to major in nursing or education (Multiple recipients/Up to \$5,000)

MATCHING AWARD OPPORTUNITIES

AES/PHEAA's PATH Program: Scholarship recipients are eligible to have their awards matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by AES/PHEAA's PATH ("Partnerships for Access to Higher Education") Program. PHEAA may grant matching funds to scholarship recipients who are enrolled in an approved Pennsylvania college or career school as an undergraduate student on at least a half-time basis, who are a Pennsylvania state grant recipient and who demonstrate financial need. Students must also be a resident of Pennsylvania, not in default on any educational loans, maintain academic progress, and not be considered an incarcerated student. The match provides last-dollar support for tuition and fees. *Scholarship funds used for reimbursement of textbook purchases are not eligible for a PATH Program match.* The scholarship recipient's information is submitted to PHEAA by TFEC staff.
